

East End Bridges Project

Several of our board members attended the informational meeting of the East End Bridges Project. We found out that the bridge is scheduled to open for traffic at the end of 2016. We found out that sound barriers will be installed on Gene Snyder near Hwy 22. We believe that with the increased traffic, areas north of 64 also have an argument for sound barriers. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) District 5 Office has scheduled repairs to I-265 in both directions between KY 146 (LaGrange Road) and Interstate 71 (mile points 30.3 and 34.7). Work began the week of March 11. This project will include replacing some sections of pavement that have settled over time and repairing some of the ramps at the KY 146 and KY 1447 (Westport Road) interchanges.

The roadway may be reduced to one lane on weeknights from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. the following morning. On weekends, lane and ramp closures are possible from 8:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 a.m. on Monday. The speed limit in the work zone will be reduced and double fines will be enforced.

Residents should be able to walk on the sidewalk and not have that area blocked by a car overhanging the parking space.

Thinking of hosting a party? We all love parties. But please remember that our neighbors are close by. Don't turn that music up too loud. The best way to make sure that the neighbors don't complain about the noise...INVITE THEM!! And please don't let your guests park on the streets. Encourage them to park at the church. There is almost always ample parking there. Use common sense and end your party at a reasonable time. If you hear your neighbors and have complained, don't hesitate to contact the police. You can visit the website for the condo documents including the Master Deed, By Laws, Rules and Regulations, board minutes and recent newsletters. In our effort to provide needed repairs and upgrades to our association property, the PG BOD has several improvements either scheduled, or in the scheduling process.

Already scheduled is the addition of six new coach type street lights to light up the entrance and sidewalk along the length of the association property adjacent to Factory Lane. These are provided and installed by LGE at no charge to the association, and are maintained on a lease basis at a cost of \$20.05 per light per month which is the same rate we currently pay for our existing coach street lights.

As you may already know, the ground water table within our 9.6 acre association is very close to the ground surface and at times, percolates to the surface (sometimes through the asphalt streets) after a rain. To reroute the underground spring water and prevent further damage to our streets, we have contacted a construction company, Flynn Brothers, with a request for suggestions to construct a functional and economical way to drain the underground water into our existing storm drain. Flynn Brothers proposed a 'French Drain' as the best option to correct our drainage problems. This repair will be scheduled this spring and will be accomplished by trenching along each side PG Dr. The underground water will be collected in the trench (trench will be lined and filled with gravel, then covered and the surface asphalt repaired), then connected via a corrugated field tile to the existing storm drain. This process will be repeated along one side of PG CIR (church side), and for a short distance on PG CIR (Paddock side). During the construction of the drain, evening access to all driveways and garages will be maintained; however, while the construction is in progress during the day, there may be short periods when a drive may be blocked.

This is the first step needed in a short-range plan to repair and maintain our asphalt streets. After the drain is complete, the plan calls for adding two additional parking spaces (adjacent to church property), and sealing of the asphalt surfaces (parking information will be provided at a later date, as the asphalt sealing is scheduled).

Part of the longer-range plan is to install 8" concrete curbs at the turns in the rear of the association (next to GS Freeway) and rearrange/remove some of the large rocks now present.

This spring will also see a rebuild of the drainage culvert at the west corner of the PG Cir, as well as replanting and fertilization of common grass areas which were severely damaged during the hot 2012 summer and drought. Additionally, we will continue to replant areas along the sidewalks adjacent to garage walls as well as addition of ground cover in selected 'problem areas' (areas which have been struggling to support grass).
