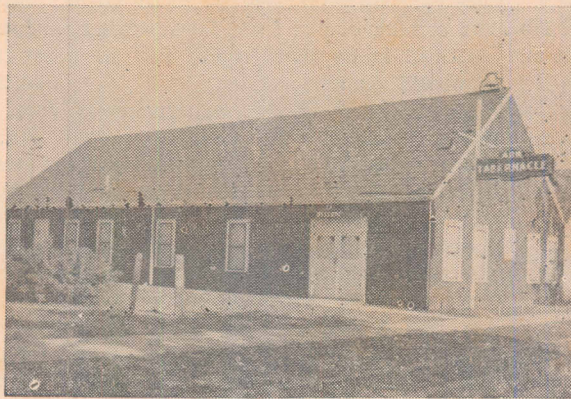

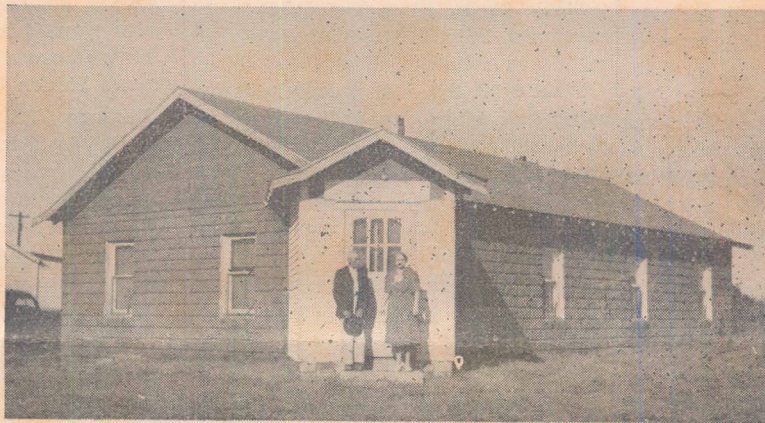

REDEMPTION

O Glorious thought and victorious goal.

Romans 8:22, 23. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body.

Matt. 24:37. But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

The thought of man was only evil continually and the earth was filled with violence. Found in Gen. 6th chapter.

Through Noah's obedience to God a place of refuge was made complete and seven days before the beginning of the flood, those worthy entered the ark and God shut the door. Then the storm in all its fury and destruction came taking life. So we read, seven years before Christ shall come, His foot touching Mt. Olivet from whence He left, 144,000 shall be redeemed from the earth (not the grave) and caught to God's throne. Then the terrible time of trouble such as never was since there was a nation nor ever shall be, will begin. This group of people will go because God's spirit will be lifted from the earth. We can see they will go for they are filled with the Holy Ghost which is the seal unto the day of redemption and will shine with the glory of the Sun, being the first-fruits of God and the Lamb.

What are the qualifications required of this class of Christians: Go with me now to Rev. 14:1-6. (Please read). Not defiled with women; for they are virgins. Rev. 19:7, 8. Let us be glad and rejoice and give honor to Him for the Marriage of the Lamb has come and his wife hath made herself ready.

And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen clean and white for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints.

II Cor. 11:2. For I am jealous over you with Godly jealousy for I have espoused you to one husband that

I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

Matt. 11:28-30. Come unto Me all that labour and are heavy laden and I will give you rest (from your transgression). Take My yoke upon you and learn of me for I am meek and lowly in heart, and ye shall find rest unto your souls (sanctification wrought by Jesus' blood by a complete consecration).

I Thess. 5:23, 24. And the Very God of peace sanctify you wholly and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you who also will do it.

II Cor. 6:14. Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? Read the remainder of the chapter. So they are not entangled in any way with the organizations of man but are a member of the glorious church that is without spot and blameless whose names are recorded in Heaven. These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth. Matt. 16:24. Then said Jesus unto His disciples, if any man will come after Me let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me.

Mark 10:28. Then Peter began to say unto Him, Lo we have left all and have followed Thee.

Matt 8:19, 20. And a certain scribe came and said, Master I will follow thee whithersoever thou goest, and Jesus saith unto him, The foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head.

Numbers 14:24. But my servant Caleb because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into that land whereunto he went and his seed shall possess it. These were redeemed from among men being the first fruits unto God and to the Lamb.

I Peter 1:18, 19. For as much as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things as silver and gold from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers. But with the precious blood of Christ as of a Lamb without blemish and without spot (Born of incorruptible seed).

James 1:18. Of his own will begat He us with the word of truth that we should be a kind of first fruits of his creatures. And in their mouth was found no guile for they are without fault before the throne of God.

The Mouth—An instrument of speaking.

Guile—Deceit, cunning, duplicity, fraud.

James 3:2. For in many things we offend all: If any man offend not in word the same is a perfect man and able also to bridle the whole body.

James 3:13. Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? Let him show out a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.

Ph. 3:20. For our conversation is a heaven from whence also we look for the Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ.

I Peter 2:12. Having your conversation honest among the Gentiles that whereas they speak against you as evildoers they may by your good works which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation.

II Peter 3:11. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and Godliness.

Psalms 50:23. Whoso offereth praise glorifieth me and to him that ordereth his conversation aright will I also show the salvation of God.

So we have a place of refuge where we are hidden with Christ in God.

Romans 5:1, 5. Therefore being justified by faith we have peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ.

By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

BRIEF HISTORY APOSTOLIC WORK, WICHITA, KANSAS

The congregation of the St. Francis Mission in Wichita, Kansas, has purchased a beautiful new church building, located not far from the business center of town. The vision of purchasing a permanent place of worship was conceived a few weeks ago and after much prayer the Lord opened the way to secure this tabernacle.

The church was dedicated to the Lord and the Apostolic Faith Movement Sunday, October 11, 1942. Brother Robert L. Farham brought a wonderful dedicatory message at the afternoon service and the Lord graciously blessed. Many were present from other places for the services throughout the day.

The message of the Apostolic Faith was first brought to Wichita by Brother Mack Wyatt in 1926. Brother Wyatt, assisted by Phil Kerr, held a very successful tent revival in what is known as Mathewson's pasture. Scores were brought into the Faith at that time but because of no permanent place of worship drifted into other independent works. From the meeting in Mathewson's pasture a building was rented on Douglas avenue and the work progressed nicely until the year 1931, when because of adverse circumstances it was necessary to give up the building. Sunday school and prayer services were then held in the home of Mrs. Alice Yeakel for sometime.

In 1932 the people again rented a place for worship as the result of a tent meeting conducted by the Barker Brothers. A few months later a nice stone church was built in Hoover Orchard, a suburb of West Wichita. Because of the distance and inconvenient way of travel it became necessary to have a place of worship in town. The work at the Hoover Orchard Church is still being carried on

by Sister Ollie Molton and Brother Kirmet McFarlane.

Much encouragement to press on was obtained from the revival conducted by Brother Elmer Russell in 1939 and the church has progressed greatly since that time. However, there has always been an unsettled feeling because of the church location being moved so often; renting a store building here and there, not knowing how long we would be permitted to keep that building. We know the purchasing of this church is a definite answer to prayer and we are certainly praising God for his blessings.

A word of appreciation is given to those outside of Wichita who generously contributed to the purchasing of the tabernacle.

Brother Eugene K. Cornell is now pastoring the work here and extends a cordial welcome to all visiting ministers.

(Excerpt from Letter)

Three times during the past six months God has wonderfully touched my body and I am so grateful. Ever since that other day I prayed for complete victory, and I knew He would heal you." We went right into the house and knelt to thank God and when we did so, again we felt His blessing.

We rejoice every moment in His Goodness and mercy and until the day we die, by His grace, we intend to trust Him. I have told so many people about my healing and while you would think they would all start praising the Lord with me, some look at me in doubt and others, actually, I believe I have read pity in their faces.

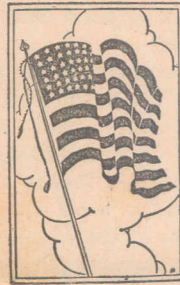
