#### FROM PASTOR LEE

I finished reading a book recently by Patrick Lencioni titled, *The Ideal Team Player*. Lencioni is one of those authors that I read whatever he writes because it challenges me to get better at life. Each month I meet with the Redhawk coaching staff and share leadership and devotional thoughts. This fall we are focusing on becoming better team players based on Lencioni's book.

Lencioni focuses on three vital aspects, values, core ideals that make great team players: humility, hunger and relationship smarts. Below are my notes from the Redhawk coaching staff meeting.

#### Humble

Lack excessive ego, concerns about status, quick to point out the contributions of others, slow to seek attention for their self, share credit, emphasize team over self, define success collectively rather than individually.

Two Types who lack humility

-Overtly arrogant people who make everything about them, they boast and soak up attention

-lack self-confidence but are generous and positive with others, tend to lack understanding of their own worth, this hurts the team because they neglect to advocate for their own ideas or by failing to call attention to problems they see.

Both have insecurity, causing one to project overconfidence and the other to discount their own talents.

Jesus dealt with proud people all the time. The proud ones were the ones who eventually had him arrested and crucified. He told this story: Luke 18:9-14 Then Jesus told this story to some who had great selfconfidence and scorned everyone else: "Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a dishonest tax collector. The proud Pharisee stood by himself and prayed this prayer: 'I thank you, God, that I am not a sinner like everyone else, especially like that tax collector over there! For I never cheat, I don't sin, I don't commit adultery, I fast twice a week, and I give you a tenth of my income.' "But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eves to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' I tell vou, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For the proud will be humbled, but the humble will be honored."

Let me never speak any word that may tend to my own praise, unless the good of my neighbor requires it; and even then let me beware, lest, to heal another, I wound my own soul. Let my ears and my heart be ever shut to the praise that comes from men. Give me a dread of applause, in whatsoever form, and from whatsoever tongue, it comes. Deliver my soul from this snare of hell; neither let me spread it for the feet of others. Whosoever perishes thereby let their blood be upon their own head, and let not my hand be upon them.

O giver of every good and perfect gift, if at any time you please to work by my hand, teach me to discern what is my own from what is another's, and to render unto you the things that are yours. As all the good that is done on earth you do it yourself, let me ever return to you all the glory. Let me, as a pure crystal, transmit all the light you pour upon me; but never claim as my own what is your sole property.
