Our guest speaker, Steve Barton, was introduced by Benny Martinez. Steve who is a resident and a member of the GAC has been very involved with the 50%/5 year cumulative rule in the Hernando County Chapter 13 Flood Ordinance. Steve gave a very comprehensive explanation of just what this rule entails, including putting homeowners at great risk for losing their homes, especially with the hurricanes that have come our way in the past two years. The current Hernando County ordinance stipulates that the substantial improvement and/or substantial damage cumulative time frame in direct opposition to that imposed by FEMA/NFIP involves a period of 5 years. FEMA's policy involves one single incident. There were many questions seeking clarification but Steve's presentation and explanations definitely appeared to build a fire under the general membership. Steve, Chuck Greenwell and Gladys Moore sent a letter to the county commissioners asking that this ordinance, No. 2014-1, be changed to a cumulative period not to exceed one year (calendar year) from the current 5-year plan. Steve encouraged all members to email the commissioners to express their concerns/

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recommendations re this very prohibitive ordinance, obviously to shorten the cumulative period as stated. More information will be forthcoming on our website and on Nextdoor Hernando Beach, including the date for the meeting where the commissioners will vote on this issue. It is beyond imperative that we stick together as a community so that, hopefully, we can experience a favorable outcome.

Upon calling the business portion of the meeting back to order, Betty McGuire moved and Benny Martinez seconded the motion to accept the minutes from the November HBPOA meeting as printed in the Dec. Beachcomber. Motion carried.

In Margo's absence, Gladys Moore gave the treasurer's report as follows:

Balance on Hand 11/01/2017 for both the HBPOA General Account and the Entranceway Account (will now be combined): \$16,235.34.

Balance on hand 12/32/17 was \$18,750.52.

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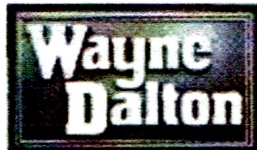

**Publicity/Beachcomber.....**Jen Brown reminded us that the deadline for submission for each new issue remains the tenth of each preceding month.

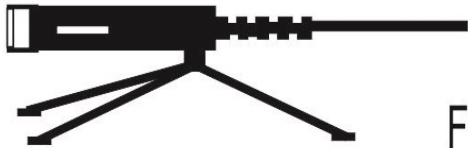

5) Six calendars are left if anyone is interested.

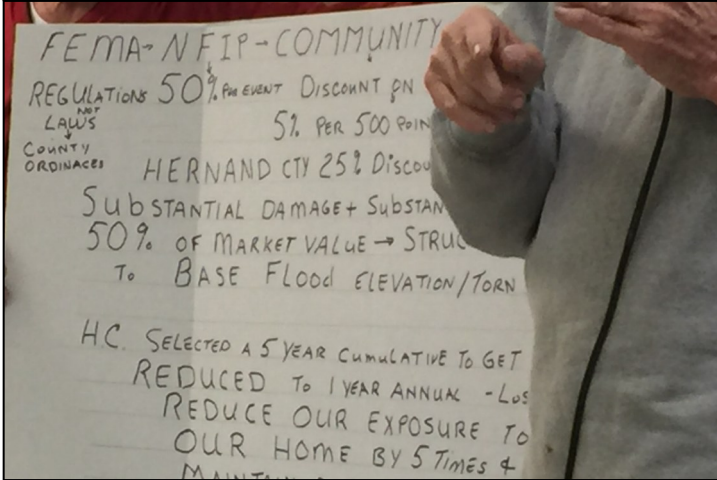
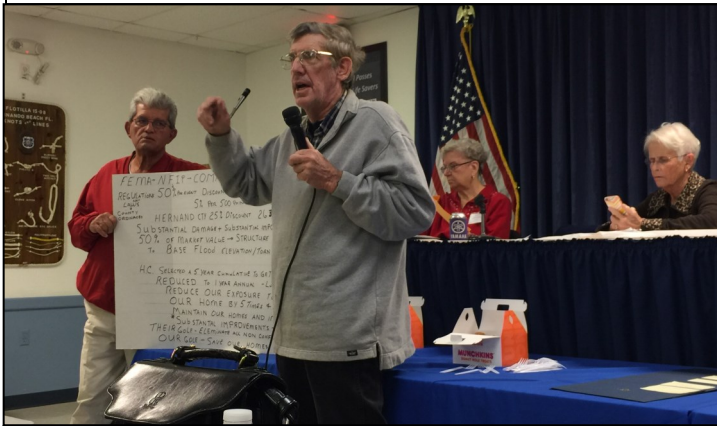
Gladys Moore moved, seconded by Erin Daly to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed and meeting adjourned at 8:45 PM.

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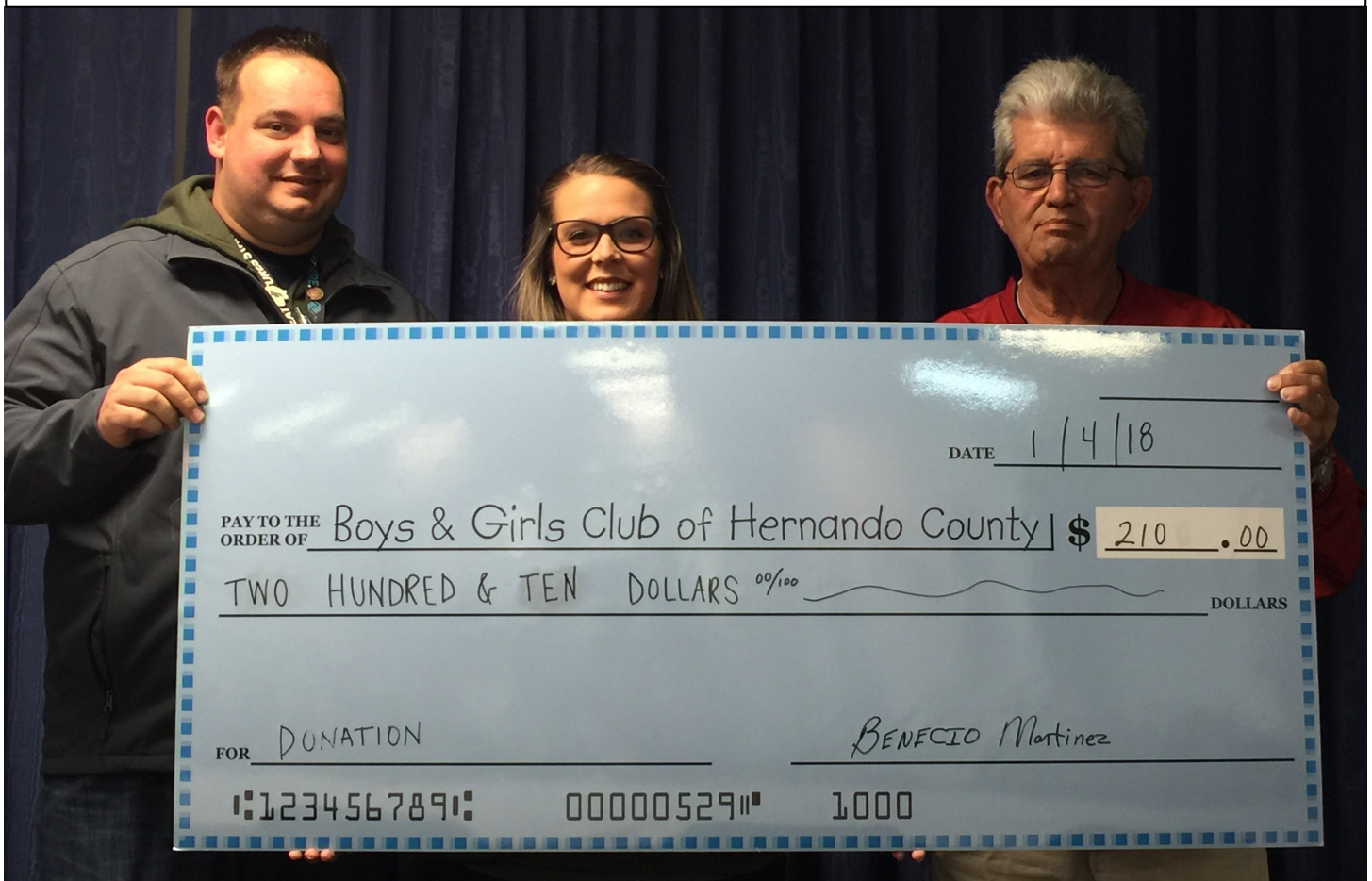
## **FEBRUARY MEMBERSHIP MEETING**

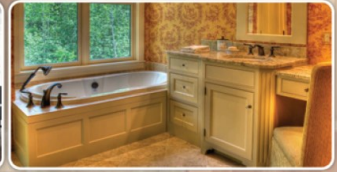
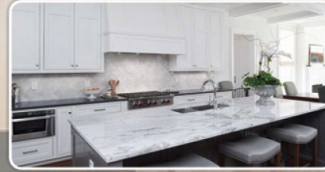

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## CRIME WATCH

**Do Your Part In The Neighborhood!**  
Help us **FIGHT** against crime in your area by joining your local **CRIME WATCH** Program.

### What is Neighborhood Watch?

Neighborhood Watch is simply "neighbor looking after neighbor." You watch out for your neighbors' homes while they are gone and they in return do the same for you. All suspicious activity is immediately reported to the Sheriff's Office.

### Neighborhood Crime Watch is Free!

All too often, residents think it costs something to belong to the program. It doesn't cost a dime - just a little bit of your time. Any money collected from donations should be carefully accounted for and deposited in an account under the name of your Neighborhood Watch Program.

### Neighborhood Watch Program

Neighborhood Watch Programs have become a highly successful crime prevention technique in the reduction of crime in many communities throughout the U.S. The major goal in the organization of the Neighborhood Watch is to change the ATTITUDES of the community members from apathy to concern and involvement. Next, invite the Sheriff's Office Community Coordinator to your first community meeting in order to establish leadership and guidance.

The first phase in the setup of your program will be to establish a communication system in order for community members to communicate with each

other, as well as law enforcement. Remember law enforcement and the community will be working together more closely in order to maintain the success of the program.

The second phase is home security. Your Community Coordinator will assist you and the residents of your community with up to date information on "making your home safer."

It is important to remember, Neighborhood Watch signs DO NOT prevent crime. Signs and decals act only as a notice to the potential criminal that "if you commit a crime in our neighborhood, the chances of being seen, reported and arrested are very good."

Ask your Community Coordinator how you can earn signs for your neighborhood.

### Patrols

Patrolling the neighborhood in your personal vehicle is NOT a requirement to be recognized as a Neighborhood Watch area. Should your neighbors wish to start a patrol, then the Sheriff's Office Community Coordinator will discuss proper procedure and training in order to be officially recognized.

Neighborhood Watch is getting people involved in crime prevention, making the homes in your community less of a target and being good neighbors to one another.

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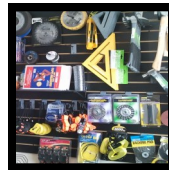
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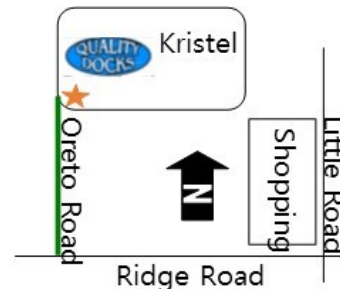
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### **US COAST GUARD AUXILIARY (15-8) NEEDS VOLUNTEERS**

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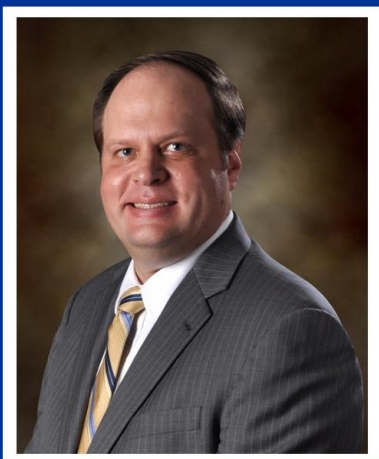
