It is almost a sacred shrine to many thankful souls, because in its little cemetery at the west side of town lies one of the worlds greatest reformers of religion.

I have stood in reverence at the graveside of that great man as have many of God's children and recalled how he fought through the ignorance of a church world in his day as a Martin Luther, for the truth of God.

To him was revealed the greatest power from God that mortal man had experienced since the early church age, the power of the Holy Ghost, the message of the latter rain.

The world stood at the threshold of a decade of war, violence, crime and bloodshed, an onslaught such as humanity had never known, one that churchanity could not cope with. God in great mercy saw it necessary to give His people more power to combat an enemy loosed to destroy mankind. As God looked on a powerless church, hopeless to withstand such a foe, He chose a man, as He always has to stand in

the gap. That man was Charles F. Parham.

Charles F. Parham brought a message of power to the world in that day of crisis. He preached it fearlessly and thousands received it and were endued with power, the same power the disciples and the early church received, the Baptism of the Holy Ghost.

Yes, we bow in reverence and recognize, as will the world if Jesus tarries, that here lies one of God's great reformers. God's special man for a special time. Beside him lies his faithful companion and helper, also his two courageous sons, Claude and Robert, who carried the message on.

They were all pilgrims and strangers, unrecognized in a wicked doomed world, still they preached the message God sent of saving, keeping grace and power from God to stand against the forces of hell loosed in our day.

Heroes of faith whom the world knew not, but known of God.

Today—students of the Apostolic Faith Bible School go out to take that same message to hungry souls who will receive.

They go with thankful hearts that God sent such a man as Charles F. Parham to a world like this, in a time when so desperately needed.

History of the Latter Rain

"Be glad then, ye children of Zion, and rejoice in the Lord your God: for He hath given you the former rain moderately, and He shall cause to come down for you the rain, the former rain, and the latter rain in the first month.

"And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions."

(Joel 2:23, 28).

"Then shall we know, if we follow on to know the Lord: His going forth is prepared as the morning; and He shall come unto us as the rain, as the latter and the former rain unto the earth."

(Hosea 6:3).

Jesus told the disciples to tarry at Jerusalem until they should be endued with power from on high. They waited in the upper room "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord and in And there appeared one place. unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." (Acts 2:1. 3-4).

This was the beginning of the former rain, then in Acts 2:39, "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." Many were baptized with the Holy Ghost and each received the evidence of it by speaking in other tongues.

"Ask ye of the Lord rain in the time of the latter rain." (Zech. 10:1).

The latter rain began in the year of 1901 during the ministry of Rev. Charles Parham.

Rev. Parham was born June 4, 1873, and at the early age of about nine years, felt the call to preach the gospel. He was not converted though until he was about thirteen and held his first public meeting at the age of fifteen years. A few

years later, after a long illness he consecrated his life to God and entered the evangelistic work.

In 1898 he and his wife established a Divine Healing Home in Topeka, Kansas. The purpose was to provide a homelike comfort for those seeking healing from the Lord

They opened the Bethel Bible College, also in Topeka, in October, 1900. This was a faith school for any Christian who was willing to sell what he had, give it away, and trust the Lord. Their only text book was the Bible and they searched the Word diligently to find those truths, and to learn how to have them wrought out in their own lives.

While the building was being dedicated for the school, Captain Tuttle, a godly man, saw in a vision, "a vast lake of fresh water about to overflow, containing enough to satisfy every thirsty soul." This is believed to be the promise of the baptism of the Holy Ghost.

Just before the Christmas holidays the students began the study of the Holy Ghost. After making a thorough study of the subject, they found the evidence of this glorious baptism to be that of speaking in other tongues.

Everyone began to feel the influence of a mighty presence and the spirit of unity prevailed. The New Year's night service was especially spiritual and everyone had a hungering to do the will of God. One lady in the school asked them to lay hands on her that she might receive the Holy Spirit. As she

was being prayed for her face was lighted with the glory of God and she began to speak in other tongues. Her English was taken from her for three days and she praised God in other languages.

The next day a room was set apart for a special prayer room and they tarried before God in song and prayer.

Brother Parham had services away from the school that night but when he returned and went to the prayer room, he found the room to be filled with a glorious light. Several had been filled with the Holy Ghost and were singing and praying in other languages. Some were kneeling, some were seated and some were standing.

One of the ladies told Mr. Parham that just before he came into the room, tongues of fire had rested above those baptized. His heart was filled with gratitude and, unnoticed, he knelt and praised God. After pouring out his heart in praise for what he had been privileged to see, he asked for the same blessing. The Lord asked him if he was willing to teach it. Bro. Parham promised to stand for this truth and soon was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Workers went from the school to Kanssas City and other places teaching this doctrine. Through great trials and persecutions, Bro. Parham stood true to the word of God and preached the Gift of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost whereby many were filled with the Holy Spirit, and sealed unto the day of Redemption.

About the year of 1906 a Bible school was held in Houston, Tex. Again God wonderfully blessed, and workers, filled with the Holy Ghost went forth to many places. Bro. Parham went with a group to Orchard, Texas, where they held a two day convention.

After the convention, with joy and sadness a group boarded the train, among them were some who were disappointed because they too had not received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost. After Bro. Parham entered the car to go to the next station, Houston, with them, he took hold of the hand of one of

Most of the people of 1947 are over-concerned about their outward adornment, social position, and financial standing. Watching the styles, keeping up with the Joneses, and pride of possessions, often detracts from spiritual living. It is human to compromise conscience and follow social and religious fashions; it is Christian to sacrifice both on the altar of truth and duty. "Now ye are clean through the word I have spoken," inward adorning. In God's show-window, (The Bible), the articles of dress that adorn the hidden man of the heart are always on display; also ornaments, which, in God's sight, are precious and priceless. (1 Pet: 3, 4). Only the strong in the Lord are dressed in spotless robes, shining garments, and jewels rare. Put on the uniform that beautifies the meek. It will keep the inside shouting and the outside shining. It is a part of you. The whole armor of God. The armor supplies those things in which one trusts for protection, in offensive or defensive warfare. It suggests military action. It is not enough to be pure. Be valiant for the cause you represent. We wrestle the rulers of the darkness of this world, and spiritual wickedness in high places. On the radio program in a state's capitol city we were singing "Power in the Blood." We were signaled off the air, and our money returned with the apology that the churches of the town thought best not to mention the "Blood." I could see what Paul meant by spiritual wickedness in high places, and the need of the armor. Put it on. It is both useful and ornamen-You will look better, feel safer and do more unless you are doing all you can, you are doing less than you should.

The girdle of Truth. The gir-

dle was an essential article of dress in the East, often worn by both men and women. When idle or at ease their robes fell loosely around them. For work or walking, the girdle was tightened, and under it was tucked the long skirts of their robes. If you are losing interest in the things of the Spirit, tighten your girdle, tuck up the loose ends of your wandering mind, and stand erect, having your loins girt about with truth. Truth crucifies big "I's", and magnifies little "U's", until all wear the same kind, color and length girdle. Two things make all one size—plenty of God's love, and six feet of earth. "What have you that you did not receive."

The breastplate of righteousness, covers, the heart, which is one of the vital organs of our being. Protect it by right living. The fine linen is the "Righteousness of the saints." Every cloud will wear a rainbow, if the heart keeps right. Joys will be your wings, and sorrows will be your spurs, if your heart keeps right.

The Gospel shoes. When returning from the Holy Convocation in the Panhandle recently, we encountered about three hundred miles of icy pavement. Once we began sliding, and narrowly escaped colliding with another car. After the scare was over. we thanked God for the protection of His unseen hand, and I thought about the Gospel shoes the Christian wears. Had our wheels been shod with chains, we would have felt more secure. And our trip would have been more pleasant. The Gospel shoes prevent sliding, back-sliding, and tenderfoot. Backsliding begins in the knees, and is the fruits of a slip-shod life.

The shield of faith. During Mr. Stanley's search for his missionary friends in the wilds of Africa, his most terrible enemy was a tribe of dwarfs, real small men who fought with small bows and arrows. They were hard to see as they hid in the grass and among the trees. Their small arrows were dipped in poison and if one stung

a member of the rescue party, it meant certain death. Surely God knew his children need protection, and has provided for them a shield of faith that quenches all the fiery darts of the wicked one. Above all take the shield of faith. By faith we prefer Christ's Cross before the world's crown.

The helmet of salvation. "But let us who are of the day, be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love; and for an helmet the hope of salvation. Goliath lost a victory because of a mis-placed helmet. The helmet protects the brain, fosters right thinking, and keeps the mind in tune with the heart. It begets a lively hope, and views a better world above.

The sword of the Spirit, is the word of God. It pulls down strongholds, cuts a clean path between right and wrong, keeps the feet on the ground going God's way—not dodging difficult things but doing them. It is wasted breath to shout about eating bread with Jesus at his table, except we invite him to eat with us at our table. The word is God's way to wisdom, security, and holiness.

All-Prayer is necessary to complete the Christian uniform. There is much to be done besides praying, but there is little we can do until we have prayed. All-ways, all-prayer, all-supplication, and all-saints, is the line up. "Some time, some how, some where each day, I'll turn aside and kneel and pray." "The devil trembles when he sees, the weakest saint upon his knees."

Put on the whole armor of God. You can receive manifold blessings, enjoy the best in this life, meet the best people in the world, and at the end of the way receive eternal life. What a Saviour.


SPIRIT, SOUL AND BODY

Man in his whole is composed in three parts, namely, Spirit, Soul and Body. 1 Thess. 5:23. The three parts of the Body are Flesh. Blood and Bone. The three parts of the Soul are Mind or Reason; Hear or Affection; and Will or Volition. The three parts of the Spirit are conscience, worship and intuition. In the Greek is the word Pneuma and means breath. a breeze, thus a breath of life. This may be applied to both beast and man. In Hebrew, Spirit is the work Ruach, and is used four hundred times and translated in twenty-two different ways. might be classified as divine, angelic or infernie, again it might be used as a state of feeling as courage, as spiritual, as coolets.

The work Pneuma "Gr" in the New Testament is used 385 times. Breath and Spirit is sometimes translated as the same word. Read the following scriptures. Pharaoh's spirit was troubled. Genesis 41:8. In fasting his spirit came again. 1 Sam. 30:12. Renew within me a right spirit. Psalms 51:10. The spirit is willing. Matt. 26:41. It is time to worship the Father in spirit and in truth. John 4:23. Now there are false spirit, pressed in the spirit. Spirit demonstrations and spirit life. Romans 8:10.

Soul-in Greek is the word Pauche and means soul man. The word Soul in the New Testament has often been changed to life, but it is the seat of life. Man became a living soul when God breathed into him the breath of life. Genesis 2:7. It is the soul that is held accountable for sin in Lev. 5:1-17. We find the laws controlling the soul that swears, trespasses, lies, etc., and also an atonement for the soul. The soul must wait for the resurrection, spirit returns to God who gave it. Spirit and Soul is connected close togeth-The Hebrew word Neash is used about five hundred and thirty times in the Old Testament for man that is, one that is mortal, frail, sickly or dying. The spirit is embodied in the Soul, and the

Timothy's Mother

There are many, many stories in the Bible about men and women, and also about boys and girls. One of these stories is about a little boy named Timothy. The reason I want to tell you about Timothy today is, he was not only a good LITTLE boy, but he was very good when he became a man.

All of you children sometimes think of what you would like to be when you become a grown man or woman. Surely you want to be a GOOD man or woman, and above all else love God. You might become an airplane pilot, or an engineer on a great train. Perhaps if you are a girl you like to dream about becoming very famous. There are many, many great and wonderful things you might do when you grow older, and yet love and serve God.

The Bible does not tell us much about Timothy, or the things he did when he was a boy. About three verses mention his childhood, but oh such wonderful words. One of the verses reads like this, "When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also."

Timothy lived in a little town called Lystra. His father was a Greek. Perhaps his father did not know and worship the true God. This is why the Bible especially mentions his mother Eunice. I feel sure Timothy lived in homes like other boys and girls at that time did. They were very different from our homes. Their schools were different too. They did not have books as we have today, but only scrolls. Timothy may not have gone to a Synagogue school, since his father was a Greek. If he did not he learned nothing about God at school.

But Timothy had a wonderful mother and grandmother. They

may not have been able to read. Most girls did not go to school. But they had faith in God. I am sure they prayed every day and taught little Timothy to pray also. When Timothy lived there was only the Old Testament, but think of the many wonderful stories in it. Do you suppose Timothy made fun of the Bible, or ran away from home and did naughty things; or told his mother stories or stole something that did not belong to him. No, I am sure he did not. Later he took care of a church, and while they were not together Paul wrote him two wonderful letters which we know as I and II Timothy.

Does a Vacation Bible School Pay?

As long as there are children, there will still be a need for work among them, a need for their learning of the word of God. The Vacation Bible School goes far to meet this need.

There are a number of things necessary to have such a school. Someone must have a vision for the need of the school. There must be children. Suitable teachers need to be willing to give of their time to the work. Some place to hold the school is also a necessity. Where there is a will there is a way, and all these problems can be worked out if the desire to have one is strong enough.

Although we will have to wait until the results are summed up in that great day, to actually determine the results of even one school, there are some actual facts that have been gathered from those who have thus labored in the past. The value to children and to teachers is immeasurable. 3 hours a day + 5 days a week + 2 weeks = 30 hours! Hours spent in the study and training of God's Word. A child attending Sunday School regularly receives about 50 hours of religious instruction in a year.

In the majority of cases this represents all the Christian training received. Compared to the more than 900 hours spent in public school where little or no attention is given to religion, this is a pitifully small amount of time to give to teaching the most important thing in life.

The above mentioned school encourages effective teaching. It makes available for teaching a longer period of time on consecutive days. It builds up the Sunday School, gets the pastor and church workers in touch with here-to-fore unreached families. There is less time for juvenile delinquency, children are kept off the streets, and leisure hours are transformed into wholesome Christian experiences. 131/2 million of America's children under twelve years of age are not touched by religious instruction-Catholic, Jewish or Protestant-including rural and urban

Many children are converted in these series of Church Schools. There is the opportunity to lead them into a definite experience of salvation. Surely this is a challenge to Pastors, Church Workers and Sunday School Workers. Let us work while it is day, for soon the night cometh, when NO man can work. In closing, here's the poem,

"Let Me Guide A Little Child!"

"Dear Lord, I do not ask

That thou should'st give me some high work of Thine,

Some noble calling, or some wondrous task.

Give me a little hand to hold in mine:

Give me a little child to point the

way

Over the strange, sweet path that

leads to Thee;
Give me a little voice to teach to

pray;

Give me two shining eyes Thy face to see.

The only crown I ask, dear Lord, to wear

Is this: That I may teach a little child.

WHAT IS FLANNEL ART?

Flannel art consists of an easel, a flannel board, flannelgraph stories, and last but not least a consecrated teacher—one who loves children and feels the need of imparting to them Spiritual Knowledge.

Although some teachers do not have an easel, some means of holding the flannel board is necessary. Do not wait to obtain an easel to start this wonderful work for your children. If you have a separate classroom a small table is handy to hold the flannel board until an easel is obtained. If it is not possible to make an easel at home, low priced folding easels can be obtained from many publishers.

A flannel board is a "MUST" for Flannel Art work. This may be made from a piece of three-ply wood, plaster board or cardboard.

It is necessary that the board be slanting, thus the advantage of an easel. This board must be covered with flannel cloth. Although outing flannel is almost impossible to obtain at this present time, even from publishers, do what you can with what you have, and your efforts will be rewarded an hundred fold. New outing is not necessary. White flannel may be dipped into dye for effective backgrounds.

It is possible to change your flannelgraph board so as to make striking effects. When an outdoor scene is desired cut a piece of blue outing flannel as long as the board and about 1-3 as wide, to suggest the sky. Sew onto this a piece of brown green or purple outing flannel to represent mountains. This should be cut a few inches wide and the length of the board with

the upper edges uneven. A piece of green outing sewed to the lower portion of the flannel will represent grass. This background can be varied by using brown for a desert and by adding blue for water.

The next necessity is obtaining pictures to use. There are a number of publishers that offer Bible Flannelgraph stories. Lessons for Sunday School work based on the International Sunday School lessons can also be obtained. The most of these are already backed and many contain complete instructions for use. Do not feel that this is a difficult method for teaching the children. I have used many others, but have found this to be the easiest to use, and the one that by far impresses the Bible upon the mind of the little ones whom we desire to lead to Christ.

PEACE WITHOUT CHRIST?

A World Congress of Religion is being called for the fall of 1948 by the Church Peace Union. According to the first announcement, the purpose seems to be to gather together representatives of all religious faiths in order to prepare resolutions in support of the United Nations. Invitations to the congress have already been sent out to one thousand men and women selected from the major religious faiths of the world.

Evidently the promotors of this Utopian scheme met some difficulties in deciding who should and who should not be invited. There are so many different religions, and so many organizations whose religious nature is open to question, that they certainly had a problem on their hands.

At last it was decided that delegates to the congress be asked to accept the following four points "as basic to the purpose and program of the congress":

1. A belief in a Supreme Being.

2. A desire for fellowship, understanding, and the practice of human brotherhood.

3. Cooperation to help secure international justice, promote good will, and provide for all men everywhere the rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

 Acceptance of the over-all purpose of the congress to unite men and women of all religious faiths in support of the United Nations.

This, evidently, is the irreducible minimum of religious requirement. But we note there is no mention of Christ—as, of course, there could not be. And what good can this congress hope to achieve without Him? A joint resolution of Hindus, Moslems, Shintoists, Confucianists, Jews, Catholics, and Protestants may sound very pious and important; but we venture to suggest that it will possess not one scintilla of value in preserving the peace of the world

Leaving Jesus out will get us nowhere. "For there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Acts 4:12.
