Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.



Beyond this initial level, you become what could be termed as *casual friends*. This could actually develop right after the initial contact. One of the people I met just last week has become a casual friend already. In that one contact I had with him and his family, we moved from names and job and school to common interests, activities and concerns, including the political situation in his country, my country and African values and cultures. We discussed goals and opinions, etc.

Next is **close friendship**. I'm sure you have friends you turn to for advice because you share the similar goals or visions in life. You trust their input and value their opinions. These are more than casual friends, yet they are not your intimate friends. You are very comfortable with them and are not afraid of being laughed at.

Intimate friendship is the highest level of friendship. These are friends you are very close to; you often spend a great deal of time with them. They will be the first people you call with good or bad news. They often feel like family and might even be closer to you than family because they have been through it all with you. At this level, you have the freedom to correct one another and point out each other's blind spots and offer solutions. You encourage and challenge each other, etc.

In today's First Reading (Genesis 18:20-32), I see some of the dynamic and precious qualities found in fourth level friendship in the relationship between God and Abraham. I became jealous of Abraham! I was trying to imagine God, the Almighty Creator, sharing his thoughts and his plans with a mere creature, Abraham. More amazing than scandalous is the fact that Abraham is almost shaming God into being just. How was he not afraid of God! How dare him address God in such a way!

And that's the whole point of the four levels of friendship. The gem of human relationship is that fourth level where and when I become free with you and can sincerely tell you what I think and ask you what I want and share with you whatever is on my mind without bothering about how you would receive or respond to it. It's when I know that what's between us is solid and strong enough to handle just about any burden or load placed on it.

This, my brothers and sisters, is what our relationship with God should be like! This is what our prayers should look like – personal and persistent! Once at this level with God, we don't have to worry about whether God cares or loves us or not, because like two intimate friends, these are a given – there's no iota of doubt about the level of care and love. *Blessings and Peace!*
