If all tickets are sold before Christmas we will contact Service NL-Lotteries about the possibility of an earlier draw date.



If you are unable to participate on Sunday and would like to make a wreath, boughs and hoops can be picked up at the McCarthy Centre on Friday, December 16th



ADVENT SEASON

The season of Advent has a twofold nature: it is a time to prepare for Christmas, when we 业 "recall Christ's First Coming among us, and it is a time when we look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of the ages. In this way Advent is a period of devout and joyful expectation" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year, 39). During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of this



Coday we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, so called because of the first word in Latin of the entrance antiphon. *Gaudete (Reioice)*. The Entrance Antiphon reads, Rejoice in the Lord always; again I sav. rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near. This joyful aspect orients our prayer and Mass today and we realize that the Lord is indeed near. As Catholics, we are called to be people of joy today and every day of our existence. The Lord is always present in our midst: in the Eucharist, in Sacred Scripture, in our hearts, and in our community. We have every reason to rejoice!

Tt was with gratitude to Pope Francis that the Diocese of Grand Falls began its Synodal Journey on the Syned Solemnity of our Diocesan Patroness – Mary, the Immaculate Conception. Based on responses heard and recorded, it was decided to create two reports: one to be forwarded to the Atlantic Region and a second to be used at our own diocesan and parish levels. In the coming weeks, in the Sunday bulletin, you will be provided with the second report (condensed version) of the parish responses that were forwarded to the Atlantic Region.

6. Involvement of the Laity

- Church needs to become more transparent and be active in involving Christ's faithful in decision making
- Clergy need to work harder at becoming involved with the laity outside of Mass
- Dialogue is needed
- Many things we value have been lost family values, family prayer. Families are not involved in Church
- The synod should have happened earlier.

7. Catechesis

- Educating youth and others about God, the Church and the sacraments is not working well
- Promoting the importance of the sacraments is essential

DECEMBER 13 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT LUCY, VIRGIN, MARTYR: Lucy

was born in Syracuse, Italy, and was martyred about 304. Because her name is derived from *lux* ('light'), during the Middle Ages people suffering from eve trouble began invoking Lucy's aid. She is also associated with festivals of light. especially in Scandinavia.

DECEMBER 14 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOHN OF THE CROSS, PRIEST, **DOCTOR:** Born in Spain in 1542, John later entered the Carmelite community and was ordained in 1567. With the great Carmelite mystic, Teresa of Avila, he worked for the reformation of his order and helped found the reformed ('Discalced') Carmelites. He wrote many spiritual classics, notably the Ascent December 16 of Mount Carmel. The Dark Night of the Soul. and The Living Flame of Love. John died in 1591, was canonized in 1726, and proclaimed Doctor of the Church in 1926. *****


