PRAYERS NEEDED FOR THE CATHOLIC CLERGY IN NICARAGUA

AUGUST 20, 2022 – Nicaraguan police on Friday, August 19th raided the residence of a Roman Catholic bishop critical of President Daniel Ortega’s administration, detaining him and several priests in a dramatic escalation of tensions between the church and a government increasingly intolerant of dissent. Bishop Rolando Alvarez was accused of “organizing violent groups,” and inciting them “to carry out acts of hate against the population.”

The Nicaraguan congress, t, has ordered the closure more than a 1,000 nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) including Mother Teresa’s charity.

YHWH - WAHWEH

There was a moment when Moses found the courage to ask God what His name was and God answered Moses. Scripture says that God’s name is, ***I Am who I Am***, but the name He gave was recorded in biblical Hebrew, thus it was spelled YHWH. Over time man added an A and an E to make it WAHWEH. However, scholars and Rabbi’s later noticed that the letters YHWH represented breathing sounds of aspirated consonants. When pronounced without intervening vowels it sounds like breathing. WA is the inhale and the WH is the exhale. So, a baby’s first cry, his first breath speaks the name of God, a deep sigh calls His name. A groan, a gasp that’s too heavy for mere words mentions God’s name. Even atheists speak His name unaware that their very breath is giving acknowledgement to God. Likewise, when a person leaves this life with their last breath and God’s name is no longer filling their lungs. So, when you can’t utter anything else, your cry is calling out to God, your cry is saying HIS name. Being alive means, we’re speaking His name constantly. Your very breathing is giving God praise. God chose to give Himself a name that we can’t help but speak every moment that we’re alive. All of us, always, everywhere, walking, sleeping, breathing are living with the name of God on our lips.

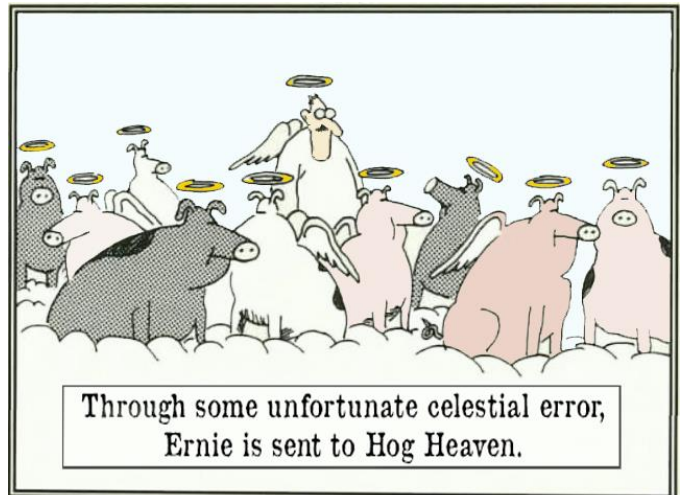
We are continuing to collect food donations for the Hurricane Food Bank and for the Springdale Elementary School.
