 - Year to date Intergovernmental General Fund revised revenue projection vs. actuals.
 - Year to date Other General Fund revised revenue projection vs. actuals.
- We are doing better than the projections.

- Health Committee
 - May is open enrollment.
 - o Direct Path.
 - Save money on medical procedures.
 - Get money back on medical procedures.
 - Fight billing errors.
 - Health Fund balance.
 - City is self insured.
 - When fund is low premiums are increased.
 - Fund balance increased when people were not getting surgery during the pandemic.
 - Dental costs projected to increase.
 - Two options:
 - Increase premiums 3% to lessen the impact of future increases.
 - Use the health fund savings to pay the dental and not have an increase in premiums for FY 2021-2022.
 - Mary voted on behalf of TSA to spend the savings and keep premiums flat.
