Example is: The Old Weeks Drug Building at B & Main (south west corner to alley) Has been transformed to a trendy Kit shop: Apron Strings', & a huge art center & gallery of the owners. They have converted the entire upper level that formerly was the Crystal Ballroom (on east side) and Jazz Dance Hall (on west side). Another major newly competed space is Armstrong's Antiques.
