2024 Convention News & Update



Have you received your 2024 Social Security Administration statement? If so, then you know the cost of Medicare has risen to \$174.

Are you enrolled in VA healthcare? You can apply with a simple phone call, and, if you are eligible, you may get FREE care to include prescriptions. Call (877) 222-8387 and find out.

Are you in receipt of compensation for any service connected (S/C) disability? With the passage of the PACT Act, the Department of Veteran Affairs can grant this benefit for many medical conditions not previously allowed. Potentially tens of thousands of new veteran claimants/claims are possible due to this act.



Many of us were exposed to toxic substances during our military service and some have developed diseases because of that exposure. You can get a lot of information at www.va.gov,and the home page is the place to start. Please look into this!

There are many Veterans Service Organizations (VSOs) – The American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans/DAV, for instance - which have service officers who can assist you with your claim. Veterans Affairs Regional Offices (VAROs) also have service centers with folks who can help, and all of this support is FREE!

If your exposure is found to be service connected, you may be entitled to monthly financial compensation, FREE medical care for that particular condition, and possibly completely FREE healthcare (These entitlements depend on the priority group to which you are assigned.

A couple of phone calls, and/or an internet search will start you on your way. You can call the DVA at (800) 827-1000 to find a VARO and medical clinics. I am still on a mission to help my sister veterans get all they are entitled to because...YOU HAVE EARNED IT!


For the past several years, we have rarely had more than two or three applicants for the MWAN \$1,000 scholarship. In fact, one year, we didn't have anyone apply.

America listed by State, as an example. The links will take you to those websites if you type them into your browser. Additionally, you can search for all public and private high schools by state. So, there are several ways to find them, it just takes a little time.

I've also contacted other veteran organizations, and asked them to put our scholarship information in their publications, but if they don't have room, they don't get listed.

The scholarship no longer requires applicants to be related to a military woman, so that widens the pool of eligible applicants.

The original goal was to locate useable flags and donate them to various veteran organizations. However, Elisabeth & Unit President Sherry Hill were stunned when they received two, industrial-sized containers which held more than 400 flags of all sizes.

The flags arrived in a variety of conditions: in-the-box new; encased in shadow boxes; on poles, and many were tattered & torn.

Sherry washed, dried and sanitized hundreds of flags, which were then placed in hand-made (also by Sherry) Christmas stockings, and delivered by Elisabeth to veterans and veteran organizations. Many of the flags on poles were placed on Sherry's driveway with a sign that read "Free"



(pictured at right), all of which found new homes.

The seven, large bags of unserviceable flags were taken by another veteran to a crematorium where they were respectfully retired.

Finally, three large flags and two burial flags were delivered to Missing in America Project (www.miap.us), which provides honor, respect and dignity by securing a final resting place for the cremains of veterans which have gone unclaimed.
