
I olmesian activity in Dayton began at Wright State University in 1973, with the foundation of THE SHERLOCK HOLMES ENTHUSIASTIC READERS' LEAGUE ON CRIMINAL KNOWLEDGE, or SHERLOCK, at Wright State University, by Professors Martin Arbagi and John Zamonski of the History and English Departments, and James Newton, an undergraduate who is now Professor of Economics at Capitol University in Columbus. The three were soon joined by Alvin Rodin, M.D., of the newly–created WSU School of Medicine, and Ritchie Thomas, Director of the University Library. The group's name was changed to the more canonical DARLINGTON SUBSTITUTES. In the late 1970s, a companion Holmesian Club, THE RETIRED COLOURMEN, formed at the University of Dayton.

Like most schools, both UD and WSU understandably restricted membership in campus clubs to students, faculty, staff, and alumni or alumnæ. Thus, there was no Holmesian outlet for the general public in the Dayton Metropolitan Area. Accordingly, THE AGRA TREASURERS was formed.

It was Al Rodin who first proposed the "Holmes/Doyle Symposium," a conference on both Sherlock Holmes and Arthur Conan Doyle, M.D. Himself a medical doctor, Al had a longstanding interest in physicians who were also writers, for example, Anton Chekov, Zane Grey, Somerset Maugham, or Walker Percy. The initial Symposium was held in 1983 under the joint sponsorship of Wright State and nearby Central State Universities, and it became an annual event. After Al's retirement and death, the Symposium was directed by **Greg Sullivan** and **Cathy Gill**, and eventually, by Cathy Gill alone.

In 2013, Cathy retired due to poor health. There was no Symposium that year, but in 2014, renamed "Holmes, Doyle, & Friends," the conference has revived, under the sponsorship of The Agra Treasurers.
