


## Paladina Health is Now Everside Health





# I ELIGIBLE FOR T



AS OF MARCH 8, THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THE COVID-19 VACCINE:

- ALL HEALTHCARE WORKERS WHO HAVE ROUTINE DIRECT PATIENT CONTACT
- **INDIVIDUALS AGED 55 AND UP**
- INDIVIDUALS WITH INCREASED RISK FOR SEVERE COVID-19 DISEASE

INDIVIDUALS AGED 16-54 WITH THE FOLLOWING HIGH-RISK MEDICAL CONDITIONS: cancer, chronic kidney disease, chronic lung disease, diabetes, Down syndrome, heart disease (congestive heart disease, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathy, pulmonary hypertension), HIV/AIDS, solid organ transplant, obesity, pregnancy, sickle cell disease.

FRONTLINE WORKERS WITH INCREASED OCCUPATIONAL RISK

Must be in-person at their place of work and perform a job in which they are at increased risk of exposure due to their frequent, close (<6 feet) and ongoing (>15 minutes) contact with others in the work environment. Examples of frontline workers include, but are not limited to teachers and daycare workers, manufacturing workers, grocery store workers, law enforcement officers, etc.

□ INDIVIDUALS IN SETTINGS WHERE PEOPLE LIVE AND WORK IN CLOSE CONTACT

Residents and workers in group home settings, homeless shelters, community training homes. State and local correctional facility staff with direct inmate contact. Correctional and immigration detention facility inmates. Migrant farmworkers living in shared housing or reliant on shared transportation.

MOUNT PLEASANT POLICE DEPARTMENT


