The Township Committee reviewed a Hampton Township Capital Improvement Road Master Plan submitted by Township Engineer H. Pellow. Township Administrator E. Klose explained that she recently met with the Township Engineer and Township DPW Manger D. Bayles to discuss the Master Plan. Kemah Mecca Lake Road and Hampton Downes Road are the top priorities and should be improved in FY 2014.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to approve the Capital Improvement Road Master Plan as submitted by Township Engineer H. Pellow & Associates, Inc.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION – RE: ROUTE 94

Township officials received a letter from the NJDOT announcing the timeframe for the Route 94 Maintenance Resurfacing Project in the following municipalities: Knowlton, Blairstown, Frelinghuysen, Fredon, Newton, Hampton and Lafayette. The entire project will begin in June 2014 and be completed by August 2014.

**SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF
SANDYSTON AND THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON FOR MUNICIPAL
ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to authorize a Shared Services Agreement between the Township of Sandyston and the Township of Hampton for Municipal Electrical Inspector Services.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION COMMITTEE

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township Committeeman D. Coranoto requested that the matter referenced above be postponed until the next Township Committee Meeting in March so that he can be present to take part in the discussion.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP CONSTRUCTION/ZONING OFFICIAL JOHN DEJAGER

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township Construction/Zoning Official J. deJager plans to retire as of June 1, 2014. Administrator E. Klose presented options to fill the position once it becomes vacant. She emphasized that potential candidates for the job should be agreeable to attending Township Planning Board Meetings. The Township Committee concurred that attendance on an as needed basis would be beneficial.

Township Administrator E. Klose added that J. deJager is also the Construction/Zoning Officer in Sandyston Township, therefore, there might be an opportunity for a Shared Service Agreement once he retires.

A **MOTION** was made by D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Klose to contact Sandyston Township officials to discuss the possibility of a future Shared Services Agreement for Construction/Zoning Officer Services.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP LOSAP PAYMENT

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the LOSAP payment for 2013 is \$33,925.00. It is a decrease of \$4,772.00 from last year's amount. More volunteers qualified this year, but not everyone received the maximum benefit due to lower percentages.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE & RESCUE, INC.

The Township Committee reviewed correspondence from Township Construction/Zoning Officer J. deJager regarding his inspection of Hampton Township Fire Station #1. He recommended installing additional snowbirds along the front and rear of the building, which will prevent large amounts of snow and ice from falling off and causing structural damage or human injuries. J. deJager also recommended installing gutter heaters that could help to alleviate excessive formation of ice dams.

Mr. deJager recommended the same course of action listed above for Fire Station #2.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Klose to obtain cost estimates for the work Township Construction/Zoning Officer J. deJager recommended at Fire Station #1 and #2 in his correspondence to the Township Committee dated 2/20/2014.

Township officials discussed replacing awnings at Fire Station #1 and #2. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that heat strips should be installed on the Township DPW Building to protect the awning over the office door, which was damaged this winter due to falling snow and ice.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Mr. Jason Scott, of ISO, a company that conducts periodic evaluations to determine a municipality's insurance classifications in communities, will be contacting Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. officials about updating the Hampton Township's Fire Insurance Classification.

OLD BUSINESS

DOLAN AND DOLAN – RE: CAGE INVESTORS, LLC – SET ASIDE OF SUBDIVISION DEEDS

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize Township Attorney F. McGovern to contact Kevin S. Krystopik, the attorney for Cage Investors, LLC, to inform him that the Hampton Township Committee has granted his client, Cage Investors, Inc., additional time to file a corrective Deed for Block 3501, Lot 44.

DISCUSSION

Mayor P. Yetter gave an overview of a meeting between himself, Township Administrator E. Klose and Kittatinny Regional High School Superintendent C. Hutchenson. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss Mr. Hutchenson's new position as the Superintendent of the Marian McKeown Elementary School. Topics covered at the meeting included improving communications between local agencies, administrative staff currently in place at the elementary school, as well as plans to hire additional administrative personnel in the future.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township DPW Manager D. Bayles is locking the gate on Rumsey Way leading to the Hampton Township Park at 3:30 PM for the remainder of the winter months to protect the township's salt supply.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that Township Recycling Coordinator K. Hansen requested four (4) certified copies of Hampton Township's Recycling Resolution after it is adopted in March. Committeeman D. Hansen also requested that the Resolution relating to the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority be adopted at the same meeting.

Committeeman T. Dooley raised the issue of the walkway that the Township Recreation Committee plans to construct at the Hampton Township Park. Committeeman D. Hansen explained certain ADA specifications that would be required for the walkway project. In order to be ADA approved, the surface must be a free draining surface, such as, cedar or stone grit. In addition, designated ADA parking stalls must be installed near the trailhead.

Committeeman T. Dooley made an inquiry regarding the status of the electrical work that JCP&L is doing for the Mike Biron Field of Dreams Project. Township Administrator E. Klose confirmed that JCP&L had to temporarily stop working on the project due to heavy snow.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she attended a Hampton Township Chamber of Commerce Meeting that was recently held at the Hampton Township Municipal Office. They discussed methods of increasing participation from small local business owners to help foster strong community ties and community involvement. Township Administrator E. Klose suggested that local businesses become more involved with the Township Recreation Committee and Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. Both entities hold several events each year that encourage and welcome participation from local residents.

At the meeting, Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the construction of the new walkway around the field, and the field lighting project are examples of local community projects that present opportunities for local township businesses to become involved with their community.

Committeeman D. Hansen noted that local businesses sometimes sponsor items such as benches, garbage cans and trees for walkway projects similar to the one planned for the Hampton Township Park.

Committeeman T. Dooley commented that the Hampton Township Rotary has kindly donated funds towards the Mike Biron Field of Dreams Project planned for the Hampton Township Park area.

Township Recreation Committee Chairperson S. Rude stated that she contacted a representative from Baleville Christian Congregational Church regarding operating the Pavilion Concession Stand during the Firemen's Parade on October 4, 2014. Church representatives, who are in possession of a Food Handler's License, will run the concession stand that day and all proceeds made that day will go to the Baleville Christian Congregational Church.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. President V. Rumsey stated that on March 8, 2014, HTVFR would be holding their Annual Installation Dinner.

On February 26, 2014, the following members of the HTVFR EMS Team are going to be honored by the Newton Memorial Hospital Heart Association for assisting in the resuscitation of a fellow HTVFR EMS member: Vera Rumsey, Dave Korver, Shelly Chattaway, Dave Gunderman, John Ashworth and Craig Pellington.

Plans for the Sussex County Firemen's Parade scheduled for October 4, 2014 are in full swing. HTVFR announced that \$100 and \$1,500 sponsorships are still available to fund the White Hat Dinner and a special luncheon.

Lowes will be sponsoring a community event in conjunction with HTVFR, the festivities will include a Hose Laying Contest.




