At Gesher Yehuda we are working on our 3 C's: Compliance, Completing My Work, and Courteous Speech.

Dr. Chaim Neuhoff, our school psychologist, has developed a new schoolwide incentive program to encourage students to improve behaviors in these areas.

Students earn points in each category several times a day. Their progress is marked on a ladder chart, each child represented by an individualized emoji. The students are able to watch their progress as they accumulate points based on their behavior. As they earn points, they rise in rank, and earn prizes and trips!

The students have been so excited and motivated to achieve higher scores, and we have been very pleased with the progress they are making in these very important categories.





Louise Sutton Suede has created a Kids Financial Literacy program, complete with visuals, workbooks and presentations. Louise came to Gesher and explained to the students how money is earned, saved, transferred and used. The students learned how banks, debit cards, and credit cards work. They learned about rent and mortgage, supply and demand, stores and websites... The students were engaged and asked some really great questions!
