The Seven Symbols of Kwanzaa

The table setting is filled with decorations, books, fruit and vegetables, that symbolizes harvest.

- ◆ Straw Mat All other symbols are placed on the mat for it is symbolic of unity
- ♦ Candleholder holds seven candles for each day of the celebration
- ♦ Seven Candles One black and white candle for it represents understanding of equilibrium and unity, three red candles, three green candles for each candle represents one of the seven principles of Nguzo Saba
- ♦ Gifts- are given during the celebration, acknowledgements of the commitments and achievements
- ◆ Agribusiness Harvest of fruit, vegetables, gems and other natural resources a symbolism and cultivation of the world
- ♦ Unity Cup Cups are filled with of cheer of fellowship
- ♦ Maize/Honeycomb corn and honey represent seeds of lineage

Three tables settings will be decorated

Two tables will be designed to display first fruits

One table will be fitted for consumption of fresh juices, fruit, vegetables and legumes
