

Taking the PMP Exam at home - What you need to know:

Administered on a secure platform using proven exam delivery technology, the online version is exactly the same as the in-person exam, there's even a live proctor. With 24/7 testing options to accommodate your schedule, you can take the exam day or night in the comfort of your **home**.

The PMP exam is a 180 multiple choice examination – Four (4) Hours long.

How does the online exam work?

- The exam will be proctored online – there will be a **live proctor** watching you at all the time to ensure no cheating.
- Recommendation – Show up **30 minutes** before the scheduled time of the exam to get through all the security protocols, the connection is safe and secure & to verify identify.
- You will be provided with an **online calculator** and an online **whiteboard** that you can type/draw (similar to MS Paint).
- **Breaks** - The PMP online exam is broken up into two halves. You must sit in one place for 2 hours to complete the first 90 questions, then you will have an **optional 10-minute break** to use washroom etc. OR you don't have to take that 10-minute break. Then continue the second half of the exam. The 10-minute break is added to the online exam. You cannot go back into the first half (90 Questions) once the 2 hours has passed.
- You **MUST** answer 90 questions within the 2 hours because of the optional break given.

What you will need:

- Computer/Laptop with a **webcam** because the live proctor needs to see you at all times, they need to see your face and you cannot walk away from the exam.
- **Fast & reliable internet** connection, if the internet fails PMI will try to reboot you back into the exam however if it continues your exam will be aborted and you will have to reschedule.
- **Quiet space** where you can spend a few uninterrupted hours. Ensure no interruptions because PMI can recognize this as cheating if you communicate with someone who enters the room.
- A **clean workspace** – the proctor wants to see a clean work desk, no paper, notes, books etc. because this can appear as cheating.
