The children were just delighted with the many game and activity options planned by Mrs. Phyllis Braxton, our Activities Director and wife of Pastor Walter Braxton who was forced back into hamburger grill duty after giving a rousing resurrection exhortation. Sister Jamila Conner greatly excited the entire crowd with Jack, her life-sized puppet who made us all believe that puppets can really sing! Throughout the church atrium, a wonderful cadre of strategically placed volunteer workers manned various food and game duty stations as happy children enjoyed the safety of the environment. The three Woodstream Church Security Officers on duty were delightfully pleasant and helpful to the volunteer workers in every way imaginable, making it even nicer for the visiting families; men appointed by God. In spite of the rain delay, it was a glorious, fun-filled day. Due to security concerns however, there were no homeless children in attendance this year. Likewise, on the day following the burial of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, there existed some serious security concerns expressed by the chief priests and the Pharisees. In making the decision to crucify Him, they were unanimously confident, but because He *promised* He would rise again, and in light of His many well-known miracles, they were now quite nervous. This insecurity prompted them to request of Pilate that soldiers be immediately posted at the tomb of "that deceiver" Jesus for at least three days "...lest His disciples come by night, and steal Him away, and say unto the people, He is risen from the dead...". (Matt.27:63-64) Acknowledging the real possibility that they had made quite a serious mistake, they reasoned that if by chance the body of Christ would somehow vanish from the tomb, "...the last error shall be worst than the first." "So they sealed the tomb and posted guards to protect it." (Matt. 27:66 NLT) BUT!...on the third day of His burial, "...an Angel of The Lord came down from Heaven, rolled aside the stone, and sat on it." (Matt.28:2 NLT) The posted soldiers, paralyzed by fear, "...fell into a dead faint." The Angel then assured the women who had come, declaring, "He is not here: for He is risen as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay." (Matt. 28:6) He then instructed them to "...go quickly, and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead..." (Matt. 28:7) And so the precedent was set by this Heavenly messenger for every successive generation of disciples of the risen, reigning Christ. Now you go quickly and tell your world! Jesus lives!! Darryl Solis

The Philemon Ministry seemed to be a solution that would help Darryl acclimate to life outside of prison. Not expecting to be released until 2022, he contacted a board member. They prayed that God would open a door. Soon afterwards, Darryl learned that the state had miscalculated his time served. He was listed for immediate release. The Philemon House had a vacancy and Darryl found a place in the ministry, reflecting that the timing was an act of the Lord Jesus.

Not every brother who is released into the Philemon ministry has the same experience. Some men profess faith but their life does not reflect it; they fall to pieces and end up going back to jail or are asked to leave the house. The

house is a safe, strong faith environment. Those who strive to live with Christ, to truly have a relationship with Him, will excel. Those who do not keep this relationship the highest priority in their lives will struggle.

Darryl says that the world takes the softness of humanity away. The devil is busy and knows how to destroy people. This destruction can come in many forms. For some, including him, this was the result of habits that developed at a young age. The music he listened to, the relationships he made, the substances he tried; these choices caused a slow fade in his spirit and he spiraled down. He did not live up to his parents' aspirations, but he is thankful that throughout his life they have always reached out to him.

Jesus will find you. Darryl had encounters with Jesus throughout his life. He recalls listening to his mother read Bible stories. Christ was evident in Darryl's first wife, whom he married when he was 18. Members at the church he attended were Christ-followers. These encounters led to an acquaintance with Christ, but Darryl's actual quest for a relationship with Christ did not start until much later in 2003. The quest ended in 2005 when he had a personal experience with Jesus. Jesus set him on the path of salvation and in 2007 Darryl laid his stake down and was born again.

Moving into the house was an answer to prayer and allowed Darryl to continue a fruitful relationship with Christ that is just now beginning to bud. The ministry is a place of refuge. It is a place to find safety in God. There, Darryl is transitioning from being incarcerated to becoming the man God is purposing him to be. There is no room for superficiality; men in the ministry need to be honest with each other, with themselves, and with God. God keeps His word, is worthy of trust, and has met Darryl's needs time and time again. Serving the Lord is time well spent. —Bekah Wolf, Contributing Writer, Philemon Ministry—



Resurrection Life

Last month we dealt with the subject "Resurrection Ready" and discovered the importance of **preparing** our hearts to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Christians all over the world celebrated and for many, the joyful celebration ended after the sermon and life has continued on as normal. My challenge to you: don't fall into that trap; instead maintain control of yourself and live a resurrected life. Just like Peter; 'Satan desires to have control over you that he may sift you as wheat". But be of good cheer for the assurance Jesus gave to Peter is exactly the same assurance given us; "I have prayed for you, that your faith does not fail; and after your victory, go and help someone else be victorious" (Luke 22:31-32) When Jesus ascended, He did not leave us comfortless! The same Holy Spirit He used to obtain victory over sin; He left to lead and guide us into all truth. (John 16:13) We too can live resurrected lives by trusting and following the direction of the Holy Spirit Who indwells every believer. Living a resurrected life each and every day demonstrates that you've accepted the atoning work that Jesus <u>completed</u> on the Cross. It means that you not only know what the <u>resur-</u> rection story says, but you also know what it means. Christ was resurrected from the dead so we can have eternal life with God AND a resurrected life here on earth! This resurrection life is not a timid, grave-tending life. It's audaciously expectant! We are assured that if indeed we suffer with Christ, we will also be glorified together with Him! (Romans 8:17) How awesome is that? Who wouldn't want to live the resurrection life?

The challenge for many is how to live out a resurrected life. Romans 10:9 gives us the first step in living a resurrected life. "Confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved". In order to receive it, we must believe it. Choosing to believe is the first step towards Living the resurrection life. Here are a few more practical steps we can take to assure that we are living the resurrection life. First, Surrender. We've got to surrender our own will and take up His. This is a conscious decision. Will we continue to go on living according to our own will, or will we allow Jesus and His Word to direct our path? This is when living the resurrection life becomes a reality. Next, Seek. If after attending church on Easter Sunday, you left feeling no connection, conviction or confirmation whatsoever, there is only one thing to do: seek His Face! Scripture tells us that he who seeks Jesus WILL find Him (Matt.7:8). Next, Serve. Part of living the resurrection life is to rely on the Holy Spirit to empower us to serve others. Peter advises, "As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God". (1 Peter 4:10) The ultimate key though, to living the resurrected life, is to follow Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths"!
