

#### WHAT IS A CLUSTER?

Even long time UPCR members might be puzzled by the term "cluster" being used in connection with a church activity. About two years ago the Presbytery of WNY was divided into four geographic groups of churches designated as clusters. UPCR is a member of the Southeastern Cluster which is a grouping of nine Presbyterian churches in this region. Randolph is the westernmost church, Springville is the northernmost and Portville is the easternmost. The intent is that the churches within a cluster will interact to find ways of worshipping together, serving together and solving problems together. Cluster meetings are scheduled periodically. Pastor Bruce Levine of the Olean Presbyterian church is the moderator of the Southeast Cluster. The October 29 service that we are hosting is the first attempt to have churches in this cluster join together for worship.
