If your WI marked the anniversary in some way (on or around the 16th of last month) please send in your photos if you have not already done so.

This year marks the centenary of WI members singing "Jerusalem" for the very first time. It was adopted by the WI because of its links with the suffrage movement and the performance of the hymn at the Annual Meeting in London in 1924 started a tradition that continues to this day.

The first Resolution urging local authorities to take advantage of the government scheme for state-aided housing was passed in 1918. Now in 2024 on 3rd October, a representative from South Yorkshire Federation will attend the Resolution Shortlist Selection meeting via Zoom – a great example of how the WI embraces the modern world to ensure its traditions live on. Finally, don't forget the 16 days of activism to end gender-based violence runs from 25th November to 10th December. Keep Britain Tidy

Barnsley Opals answered the call for members who had a keen interest in supporting the Keep Britain Tidy campaign, to coincide with its 70th anniversary for an article in WI Life.

Conceived as a Resolution in 1954, 'to inaugurate a campaign to preserve the countryside against desecration by litter' it became what we now know as the Keep Britain Tidy campaign.

The WI still campaigns today to raise aware of litter, recycling and single use plastics. BOWI have often undertaken activities to support this valuable cause but for one of our members it has become a passion.

Anne Untisz our Vice-President and her husband started litter picking in their local woods and on the main route into Royston during lockdown. Since then, they have collected well over 800 full sacks of rubbish!

The Climate Coalition's National Day of Action – Saturday 12th October

The WI is joining a coalition of charities and campaigners led by River Action UK for a march and rally in London to demand that our new government takes urgent action to address the UK's water pollution crisis. This is a perfect way to support our WI resolution on Clean Rivers for People and Wildlife.

Before joining the march, the WI will hold a pre-meeting nearby so that members can learn more about the campaign and join together to march behind the WI banner.
