Thanks to our SD Gerry Forster who submitted the following article regarding our Algarva's Charity Committee assisting another intellectually disabled person in need.

The youth in need is Abbey Leblanc , a 16 year old young lady who attends Alexander Mackenzie High School in Sarnia. Abby was born premature, has cerebral palsy and cannot get around without a walker or wheelchair. She's had a lot of struggles, Mary Leblanc said of her daughter who just wrapped up her first year at AMSS.

The last few years have been hell, motivating Abby to attend school. She was teased a lot in elementary school.

Happily, her first year at high school has been a positive experience. One day at school a teacher, Mr. Walker, must have seen something in Abbey. He asked her if she would like to try out for the 200 meter wheelchair race.

The rest is history. Abbey was set up in a special racing chair and began practicing. At the SWOOSSAA Track and field meet in Chatham, in her first ever official race, she broke the record for Women's wheelchair 200m dash, at 2:12.82.

The family's request was for a laptop computer, to be set up by her teacher, so Abbey could keep up with the homework. Also since she cannot get up and about like other teens, she can now keep in touch with her new friends and students via message or Facebook, with her mothers help.
