Robert W. Armbruster, 73 of Pigeon, passed away Tuesday, Jan. 12 at St. Mary's Medical Center in Saginaw.

He was born in Pigeon on March 4, 1919, son of the late William C. and Perle (Pfaff) Armbruster. On Jan. 25, 1947 he was united in marriage to M. Frances McIlbargie in Pigeon. She survives him.

Mr. Armbruster served in the South Pacific during World War II as a member of the Army's Red Arrow Division, and was a lifetime member of the Tip-of-the-Thumb VFW Post #2236, Pigeon. A retired farmer, Mr. Armbruster was a member and past president of the Huron County Farm Bureau. He was Winsor Township Supervisor for many years and a substitute rural mail carrier. He was a member of the Lions Club International and the First United Methodist Church in Pigeon.

Survivors include his wife, Frances; one daughter and son-in-law, Karen and Frank Sanchez, Walled Lake; three sons and daughters-in-law, James R. and Tammy, Thomas and Debra and David and Laura, all of Pigeon; 11 grandchildren; one sister, Mildred (Edward) Genschow, Bay Port; one brother, Donald (Pearl) Armbruster, Caseville and several nieces and nephews.
