# What shall I return to the Lord for all his bounty to me? Psalm 116:12

Dear Folks,

The core understanding of the psalmist in Psalm 116 is that the Lord blesses and blesses bountifully. The psalmist's prayer for help has been answered. He has been delivered from his suffering. Now, for all the blessings that he has received, he desires to return a portion of that blessing back to the Lord. He does that by calling on the name of the Lord in thankful worship, offering sacrifices and his service in the name of the Lord.

In this month of Thanksgiving, it is natural for us to think about our blessings and to give thanks for all that we have. But do we think about where those blessings come from and what responsibility we have to steward those blessings?

Many times, especially with Fall Stewardship Programs in churches, we might associate giving thanks in connection to our financial stewardship and the stewardship of our time and talents. Have you considered your worship as a way of giving thanks to the Lord? In the parable of the 10 lepers, all are healed but only 1 returns to give thanks. Are you counted as the 1 in 10 or the 9 in 10?

What I hear many times from members and others is that there isn't enough time. Enough time to get all the work done, enough time to fit in all the children's activities, or family responsibilities, or work requirements. Yes, many of us are stressed with forces and responsibilities which seem beyond our control. We can feel there is not enough time to do all that we want to do. Yet, with God there is enough, because God is the giver. Perhaps a conversation with God might help. May God guide you in using all the blessings we have

bountifully received so that each of us knows we do have enough to offer.

On Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, the Stewardship Committee offers their thanks for your faithful stewardship of your time, talent, and treasure by serving a made-to-order breakfast following the 10 am worship service. Please join us for a fine breakfast and a good time of fellowship.

Don't forget the Annual Congregational meeting on Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup> following the 10 am worship service. Along with approving the 2020 budget, we will elect church council members and a member for the Student Loan Committee. If a Nominating Committee member asks you to serve, please prayerfully consider your answer. Don't let "no" be your first answer. We need everyone working together to have a strong community in service to the Lord. At this meeting, we'll also be discussing the worship service times for the coming year. Shall we continue with one service on Sunday? Is the time working? Are there other worship times and opportunities we should explore?
