The Kirkwood Lift Station Diversion and Abandonment update

The City of Houston is planning to abandon the existing sanitary sewer lift station on the east side of Kirkwood, south of the Buffalo Bayou Bridge. Construction contract has been awarded. A preconstruction meeting is scheduled for October 22nd. Construction contract starts October 28th, but we may not see physical construction before the end of the year, and is scheduled for 520 days.

Kirkwood Paving and Drainage Project

This project will reconstruct Kirkwood Road from Buffalo Bayou to Westheimer Road in two projects, and add substantial in-line detention underneath the new roadway. The first project goes from Buffalo Bayou including the Briar Forest intersection. Construction bids are due October 17th. Construction is to start as early as February, 2020.

Super Neighborhood 18

Country Village is part of Super Neighborhood 18. There is a monthly meeting on the third Tuesday of the month. The meeting is now held at the Village Place Clubhouse at 11315 Lakeside Place Dr. The meeting is open to all residents. The next meeting is on November 19th from 6:30-8:00.

SECURITY LETTER

To the residents of Country Village:

Please be alert for criminals. As the Holiday Season fast approaches, Amazon and other delivery companies will be busy delivery packages. With many of these packages being left on residents door steps, please be observant. If you see something unusual please call the Constable immediately - their number is **281-463-6666**. Give the officer a good description of the individuals and their mode of transportation. But please, do not attempt to stop them... no package is worth the potential for violence. Many residents have been installing the new video door bells. They are reasonably inexpensive and easy to install. We put one on our front door in 30 minutes and it gives a great panoramic view of the front walkway and sidewalk. Many crimes are crimes of opportunity - unlocked cars, garage doors up, equipment left out in the open. It only takes a second for a criminal to strike.



For new residents to Country Village, we contract with the Precinct 5 Constable for neighborhood security. Please contact their 24 hour dispatch number (281-463-6666) if you see anything that looks out of the norm. The Constable can respond typically in 3-5 minutes. They also track crime statistics. If HPD is called out, we do not get a report of the event and it often takes longer for them to respond. Crime levels in Country Village are very low. If a resident is going on vacation you can contact the Constable and they will put a vacation watch on your property. Please be alert and call

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Fall Energy Saving Tips

Fall is an ideal time to make repairs that will make your home more energy efficient, both saving you money and keeping you warmer. Even if you can't afford major repairs, such as a new furnace or new windows, there are small things you can do to save big bucks on heating costs – and you can handle most of them yourself.

Caulk around windows. Warm air can escape and cold air can enter your house if the area around your windows has cracks. Caulking needs to be replaced periodically, and you should check every fall for holes that need to be patched, as well as holes anywhere outside your house.

Replace weather stripping around doors. If you can see light around the edges of your doors, you need new weather stripping.

Close up your fireplace. Make sure your flue closes all the way, and check whether you can feel air coming in when it's closed. Glass doors around your fireplace opening are another way to keep warm air in and cold air out of your house.

Put up storm windows and doors. If you have older windows and doors, adding storm windows and doors can help considerably. Window insulation film is another option to provide a layer of protection.

Improve your insulation. Insulation deteriorates over time, so you may want to add more material in your attic. Other places to add insulation are in crawl spaces and exposed areas of decks. An insulating cover over your attic opening also helps trap in the heat.
