A MESSAGE FROM WALK #209 SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Camp Alamisco! What a beautiful and peaceful place. We will gather there August 24-27,

for Men's CAEW #209—I am so excited, and full of expectation knowing that we all have a divine appointment with the Holy Spirit in that place. Gathering with brothers and sisters in Christ to worship God in his beautiful creation are very special to me. Please join me in praying, that it will be for these pilgrims as well.

In Genesis 27-28, we find the story of Jacob's ladder. Basically, Jacob steals his brother Esau's blessing from his father Isaac; fearing for Jacob, his mother Rebekah sends Jacob to her brother's in another town. Along the way, he stops for the night and he falls asleep using a rock for a pillow. He has a dream of angels climbing up and down a ladder that extended from heaven down to earth. Interestingly, he also dreams that God spoke to him, the very words of blessing that were first spoken to his grandfather Abraham. Notice that God spoke to Jacob even after he had stolen his brother's birthright – even though he had been banished by his family. In this dark night of Jacob's soul, God speaks words of promise that all will be well for him in spite of how it seems in this moment. And when Jacob woke up, stunned and afraid, he says; "Surely the Lord is in this place..."

I find it so encouraging that God comes to Jacob! Jacob sees the glory of God in this place. He sees the hope and the promise for his future – even though he's done nothing to earn it. In fact, he's done almost everything in his power to show how undeserving he is.

Ancient writings record that there are some places on earth where the separation between heaven and earth is narrower-- thinner. A "thin place" is where the veil that separates heaven and earth is lifted and one is able to receive a glimpse of the glory of God...a place where human beings could more directly and intensely experience God. It's like being able to pull back the veil that separates us from God to vividly reveal his Divine Presence.

I believe that these men on CAEW #209 will discover such a "thin place" this week at Camp Alamisco. My prayer for you is that sometimes (and hopefully often) this place and others, can become holy places, holy moments—thin places where you find God breaking in to your heart; a time and place where you find yourself saying like Jacob:

"+-Surely God is in this place."



CAMP ALAMISCO LODGING INFORMATION

Lodge/Cabins: available on a first come first serve basis. They have bunk beds and community showers/bathrooms. Per bunk, they rent for \$25/night, or \$75 for the weekend. Three meals are included per day. You must provide all of your own linens.

Campsites: 3 spots available, where you can bring your own motor home. The campsite rates are \$30/night or \$90 for the weekend, and includes three meals for two people.

Alamisco Inn: which features three "suites" upstairs, that includes TWO queen beds, ONE set of bunk beds, and ONE pull out sectional "single bed" sleeper. It also has its own kitchenette.

Suite #1 (Accommodates 6 People) is \$100/night or \$300 for the weekend.

Suite #2 (Accommodates 4 People) is \$67/night or \$200 for the weekend.

Suite #3 (Accommodates 6 People) is \$100/night or \$300 for the weekend.

**All Suites - All Linens are provided.

Downstairs Rooms (One double bed) are \$45/night or \$135/weekend.

* Downstairs Rooms - Linens are provided.

*All Alamisco Inn Suites include three meals for 4 people included in the cost of the suite.

For those at camp not staying in lodgings: Meals - Breakfast \$5.00, Lunch \$5.00, Dinner \$8.00.

WHO CAN ATTEND THE EMMAUS THREE-DAY EVENTS?

It is the policy of The Central Alabama Emmaus Community as well as The Upper Room - Emmaus Ministries, that ONLY persons that have completed a 3-Day Weekend (Emmaus, Chrysalis, Cursillo, Tres Dias, etc.) may participate in and attend:

Additionally, children should not be brought to the events. Families ARE encouraged to attend the follow up dinners held in each cluster after each walk. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation with this.
