

BUMC SECURITY POLICY ADVISORY

Effective until further notice...

- All exterior doors of the Brewerton United Methodist Church are to remain <u>locked</u> at all times.





"Walk in My Shoes A New Relationship and God's LOVE"

Over the past couple of months, I've had the pleasure of working & bonding with a new volunteer. He is not new to the pantry. He and his girl friend have been regulars at the pantry for the past couple of year.

They have no transportation, but live close enough to walk, so they travel to the pantry for their monthly food allotment and unlimited bread, pulling their extra long, canvas-lined wagon. The pantry staff has gotten to know them & have developed a relationship with the young couple.

While she is shy & reserved, he is outgoing, friendly, energetic & eager to "fit in." They always leave with a big "THANK YOU" and wide smile on their faces.

One day, he and I had an opportunity to talk at length. He shared stories with me, told me he has a passion for fishing & thanked me more than once for helping him "put food on his family's table." Our conversation shifted to a discussion about the fresh produce and massive quantities of bread we always have available.

I explained how that is made possible through our Grocery Rescue program that happens each Thursday. I explained the process to him, which includes unloading a shipment of as many as 30-50 banana boxes, filled with fresh produce, dairy products, bread & meat, often weighing in excess of 500 to 800 pounds, off a Food Bank truck. I told him that a team of 4 to 6 strong-willed women were currently doing the work. He listened intently as I described the procedure; his eyes grew BIGGER the more I talked. He appeared to hang onto my every work.

Suddenly, he jumped in and with great enthusiasm said he wanted to help us. He went on to say he wanted to "give back" for all we had given him and that he had been looking for something to do to feel productive.
