A reminder to all that Mass in Tabor on Saturday, June 15th will be at 4:00 pm. This past week marked 75 years since D-Day. Although I was not alive at that time, I have read accounts of the battle, seen films that depict it, and I hope to visit the site in the future. I have read the book *Band of Brothers* by Stephen Ambrose and I have watched the HBO series with the same title about the airborne troops that dropped during World War II. This book also includes some references about Msgr. Francis Sampson who was a priest of our diocese and wrote a book titled: *Look Out Below! A Story of the Airborne by a Paratrooper Padre*. This event helped combat the German army and bring peace to that part of the world. It is incredible that our world got to that point but many people were able to call evil out for what it is and combat it. Last week, I mentioned the need for courage in living out our faith and a great amount of courage was needed for soldiers to go into combat and come face to face with evil and the same is true today.

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost and the beginning of the Church. It is fitting that we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the building of Saint John the Baptist Church in Lesterville alongside Pentecost. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit work with one another along with the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love and the cardinal virtues of prudence, justice, temperance, and fortitude. I would like to offer a brief definition of each gift to help us understand what God has given us or will give us in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Wisdom is the gift that allows us us to understand things from God's point of view and seek to do God's will each day of our life. Understanding is more than just knowing that 2+2=4; the gift of understanding allows us grasp and integrate the teachings of Jesus and the Church into our lives. The gifts of counsel and fortitude/courage go together. Counsel gives us the ability to judge how best to act and fortitude/courage helps us follow through with what counsel presents to us. We can also think of the gift of counsel as offering advice and/or guidance to someone seeking help from you. The gift of knowledge allows a person to understand the meaning and purpose God has for him and to live up this meaning. It differs from wisdom in that it is an action, not just a desire to live up to the ways of God and it differs from understanding in that it is not just an ability, rather it is a knowing. The gifts of piety and fear of the Lord are linked together in a unique way. Piety helps us grow in the willingness to worship and serve God. This means that it is more than just a duty to worship and serve God. The fear of the Lord helps us acknowledge who they are in perspective with who God is. A distinction that has formed my view of God is the difference between servile fear and filial fear. Servile fear is the fear of the punishment that may come when an offense has been given. Filial fear is the fear of hurting or damaging the relationship between two people, usually as it relates to a son or daughter doing something that could damage the relationship that they have with their mother or father. 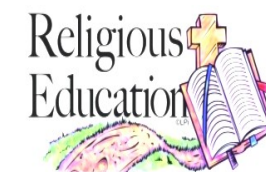
