
# JUNE 15 & 16, 2024 11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## We walk by faith, not by sight. (2 Corinthians 5:7)

Ruth was struggling with her teenage children. She loved them and prayed for them and set healthy boundaries for them, but their irritability and poor choices made her feel that she wasn't doing enough. Some days she even wondered if she was failing as a parent.

Then one morning she read this verse from St. Paul during her prayer time: "We walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). As she read it, she felt a nudge from God to read it again. As she reflected on the things she was viewing "by sight," especially her children's struggles and her own doubts about herself, she felt God prompting her to see them "by faith" instead.

Ruth thought about how often she had reminded her children that she loved them and that God loved them. She thought about how she brought them to Mass every week, where they received Jesus' Body and Blood in Communion. She thought about how she had taught them to apologize and offer forgiveness to one another, and how they did it, even if it was begrudging at times!

Ruth also reflected on the passages from God's word that had meant so much to her, versus like Isaiah 54:13: "All your children shall be taught by the Lord; great shall be the peace of your children." And Matthew 13:31-32, where Jesus describes how the smallest seed can produce the largest of plants. Closing her Bible, Ruth's heart felt lighter and her mind felt clearer.

Think about a burden you are carrying today. Now, ponder today's words from St. Paul: "We walk by faith, not by sight." How is the Lord inviting you to view that situation by faith? Perhaps you could search out or recall Scripture passages that give you the gift of faith, and he is so pleased when you use it!

"Lord open my eyes to see your presence and your faithfulness."

I am very pleased to acknowledge a significant improvement in the church: the beautiful new vestibule doors. The previous glass doors were both unsightly and nonfunctional, as they allowed a great deal of heat to escape and cold air to come in. Furthermore, they created a great deal of noise, especially on windy days. In light of these problems, one of our parishioners generously stepped forward and offered to build custom doors as an offering to the church, donating both the labor and the materials. The result is both functional and beautiful. The craftsmanship and attention to detail are remarkable, and I want to express my sincere gratitude to this anonymous donor and artist. While the openings in each door are temporarily filled with polycarbonate, they will soon be filled with two custom stained glass panels to complement the fine woodwork. As the anonymous donor generously made an offering of the new doors, it is my hope that some of you will be inspired to make a donation towards the cost of the stained glass panels. This project, along with others in the church, is a way of offering the best possible to God. In striving to create for the church what is not only functional but also beautiful, we express our love and reverence for the Lord. These improvements show that the church is a holy place of encounter with God, as opposed to an industrial and commonplace building like so many others.

You will also notice significant changes to the landscaping in front of the church and rectory. This project, which is also being made possible by special donations and volunteer labor, is a work in progress and will be the topic of my column in next week's bulletin.
