Sunday Reflection: Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, is the one who rules over all creation with love and peace. Unlike earthly kings who often rule with power, Jesus reigns from His cross, offering us forgiveness and mercy. His kingdom is not about wealth or armies; it is about bringing love, justice, and hope to all people. Jesus shows us a different kind of leadership—one that puts others first and serves with humility. The title "King of the Universe" means that

Jesus is above all things. All creation—everything in heaven and on earth—is under His care. As King, He knows our needs, our worries, and our pains. He walks with us in our struggles and celebrates with us in our joys. His love reaches every part of our lives, from the smallest moments to the biggest challenges.

On this special feast day, we are reminded to make Jesus the center of our lives. When we follow Christ as our King, we choose to live with kindness, forgiveness, and faithfulness. We are called to bring His love into the world by helping those in need, standing up for what is right, and being a source of comfort to others. As we honor Christ as King of the Universe, we also look forward to His promise of a kingdom of peace and joy. One day, He will return, and His love will bring a new heaven and a new earth. Until then, we trust in His guidance and live as people of His kingdom. May Jesus Christ, our King, always reign in our hearts and lead us closer to God.

THE "COMMUNION OF SAINTS"

The "Communion of Saints" is a Catholic teaching that connects all members of the Church — those in heaven, those on earth, and those in purgatory. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) explains that the Church is like one family, with all its members united in Christ (CCC 946-948). We believe that through Jesus, we are connected with everyone who believes in Him, whether they are alive, in heaven, or awaiting heaven.

The Communion of Saints has three main parts:

- 1. **The Church Triumphant** These are the saints in heaven. They lived holy lives and now see God face to face. We honor them, and they inspire us to live faithful lives. We also ask for their prayers, believing they can help us, as James 5:16 says, "The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."
- 2. **The Church Militant** This includes Catholics on earth who are still working to follow Jesus and grow in holiness. We pray for each other and support each other on our journey to heaven, as Saint Paul encouraged in 1 Thessalonians 5:11: "Encourage one another and build each other up."
- 3. **The Church Suffering** These are souls in purgatory. They are being purified so they can enter heaven. We pray for them, offering Masses and prayers, asking God to have mercy on them. In 2 Maccabees 12:45, the practice of praying for the dead is praised as "holy and pious."

In this way, the Communion of Saints reminds us that we are part of a great family, supporting each other in faith and love across time and space. We believe that all of us — the living, the dead, and the saints in heaven — are united in Christ, helping each other on the journey to eternal life.
