It's hard to believe that a new school year is upon us again! Recently, we provided a parent toolkit handout, *The Facts. Your Future.*, at our youth programs. This program teaches parents how to have difficult conversations with teens regarding the dangers of substance use. August 31 is International Overdose Awareness Day. Last year, ACTS distributed 2,867 boxes of Narcan to the people we serve and the community, which was up 159% from the previous fiscal year. Starting in July 2023, we added stickers to the Narcan boxes with helpful information for individuals to find out how to get more doses if they need it in the future. Additionally, we are planning on distributing Narcan on August 31 at several of our locations – more information will be emailed out in mid-August. Having difficult conversations with loved ones and providing Narcan are two tools we can use to help reduce overdose deaths in our community.

Do You Know What an Overdose Looks Like?

August 31 is International Overdose Awareness Day. <u>Provisional</u> <u>data from the CDC</u> shows that 105,542 died of overdose in 2022 compared to 16,849 drug overdose deaths in 1999. Here are common signs of overdose for opioid drugs:

- No response to stimuli
- Shallow, labored or no breathing
- Cannot be woken up
- Snoring or gurgling
- Blue/grey lips or finger tips
- Floppy arms or legs

Overdose symptoms vary depending on the substance used. Click to see common overdose signs for <u>alcohol</u>, <u>depressants</u>, <u>opioids</u>, <u>psychoactive substances</u> and <u>stimulants</u>. If you or a loved one have a substance use issue, call us at 813.246.4899 for help.

ACTS Starts Screening Weekly for Intermediate Care Program

Starting Tuesday, August 1, 2023, ACTS two Intermediate Care Programs will be hosting weekly screenings at our Intermediate Care Program located at 1229 E. 131st Ave., Tampa, FL 33612 for new potential residents. At ACTS Intermediate Care Programs, residents receive treatment with stays ranging from 90 to 120 days for those with mental health with or without substance abuse co-occurring disorders. Each resident receives an individualized treatment plan. Case management and care coordination services, medication assisted treatment, wellness education, and therapy to address relapse prevention are also made available to residents.
