## Greenbush Township Regular Board Meeting

The regular meeting of the Greenbush Township Board was held October 5, 2015 at 7:00PM. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Jones and the Pledge of Allegiance followed. All board members were present.

Havens made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, Jones supported and the motion carried.

Tim Black, Bud Delavan and Roger Dershem from the Lions Club Recycling Center spoke with the Board. The Center makes about 1/3 of what it used to. They are currently about \$4000 in the red. To save money they had used crushed glass under the new addition instead of bringing in sand. Their records indicated Greenbush Township had donated to the program once since 2010. They were asking for additional support for this year and next. The board will verify the records and consider their request when preparing the new budget.

The minutes from the last meeting were read. Havens made a motion to approve them, Jorae supported, and the motion carried.

Hayes made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as read, Smith supported, and the motion carried. Havens made a motion to pay orders #1305 thru #1319 plus the Eureka Street lights Consumers bill for a total transfer of \$33,515.53, Hayes supported and it carried.

The footings will be going in soon. Beck's old tanks will be removed. He stated these tanks are safer than the ones you have in the yards at your homes.

Our County Commissioner, Kam Washburn reports:

\*The County has approved the Nathan Beck project stating they believe the community will benefit.

\*A nuisance goose hunt was approved for Motz Park as the goose population is excessive and is creating a health hazard on the beach and reducing water quality.

\*A mental health evaluation contract was approved for jail inmates.

\*A new director has been hired for Community Mental Health.
