Welcome to the Willette church of Christ, where you will find the Bible as our only rule for faith and practice. We seek to speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where the Bible is silent. We want to call Bible things by Bible names and do Bible things in Bible ways.

Tidings from Timothy

There are not many

more fundamental doctrines than the resurrection. This morning I hope to show you that the resurrection is essential not only to an understanding of the Christian life, but to understand History, Eschatology (the doctrine of final things), and Theology in general. Resurrection is THE doctrine that sets Christianity apart from many other religions and world views. Let's study on it this morning.

Jesus did so much that the world itself could not hold all the books about Him (John 21:25). There are many great Old Testament Characters, but every story about Jesus is just golden. Tonight, we look at how Jesus went to a wedding and turned water into wine: John 2.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

The Hatton Half: The Marvelous Monogeneis

When we read John 3:16, a prominent phrase that may stand out in our minds is "gave his only begotten son." Often, upon reading this phrase, we would just glance at it and not really give anymore thought. However, it must be considered that something more significant lies within this phrasing. Let us now explore the main point that John wanted to make. Let us look at it more closely from the standpoint of the Greek. The word in the original language is μονογενῆ, which conveys the idea of Jesus' sharing the same things with the Father. We must remember the writings of other biblical authors when considering this point. Paul stated on no uncertain terms that Jesus was the fullness of the Godhead bodily (Col. 2:9). When John discussed our Master, he described our Lord by using "the Word" (John 1:14). A similar sentiment is expressed insofar as the unique nature of Jesus is concerned. More specifically, Jesus is the only one who possesses the relationship He does with the Father. No person living this day may attest to having the same relationship that Jesus has with the Father. He is the only one who has been conceived miraculously in the virgin's womb (Isa. 7:14; Mat. 1:18-25). He is also the only one who is able to plead our case. The only way a person can be a true advocate is if someone has been through a similar situation and knows what a particular situation is like. Luckily, our Master has lived a life on this earth, yet did so without sinning (Heb. 4:15). With that, He is able to be our advocate with the Father (1 John 2:2). It was Wayne Jackson that observed "Christ's mission to earth was not to condemn; instead, it was to provide a way of redemptive rescue" (Jackson 146). He is the only one who could do it and He did it. The Father's wrath was satisfied and the pathway was paved for redeeming all mankind (Isa. 53:11). Let us consider all these things and know the intimate relationship Jesus has!

Those attending: I think all the members by this time know the drill. If you are coming back for the first time, or visiting with us, then note that there are TWO morning services and that an evening Bible Study and Wednesday night Bible Study are live-streamed on our YouTube channel. You are welcome at our worship services, just keep in mind the precautions that have been put in place. Also note that if you have symptoms of the virus you need to please leave to get that

checked out. Everyone is welcome at church, but the wisdom of testing for pathogens when symptoms show and quarantine until the results are known is clearly taught in Leviticus 13-17. (Tim)
