

# THERE'S GOT TO BE A MORNING AFTER

Do you remember the movie The Poseidon Adventure? Not the more recent one but...the REAL one? Released in 1972, it was one of the first "disaster movies" made. And I LOVED it! Gene Hackman. Ernest Borgnine. Red Buttons. Shelley Winters. Roddy McDowell. Stella Stevens. I nearly get giddy just thinking about how much I liked that movie as an 11-year old!

Do you remember the theme song to that movie? It was during the stretch when Hollywood wanted theme songs- both movie and TV- to "have legs" on the radio. They wanted to have the movie nominated for an Oscar and the movie theme song nominated for a Grammy! (The theme song, ironically, DID win an award- the Oscar!) The song was The Morning After as sung by Maureen McGovern.

Hitting Number One for 2 weeks in 1973, the song includes these words: "There's got to be a morning after. We're moving closer to the shore. I know, we'll be there by tomorrow. And we'll escape the darkness. We won't be searching anymore." And do you know what those beautiful lyrics make me think? "How could that tripe win an Oscar?!"

Seriously, not the best song ever written! BUT- it has something to say to us as we move to the "other side" of Easter. As you read this, Easter is either A. almost here or B. over. And that's a challenging time for a church. Churches tend to grow and swell as they get closer to Easter. And we have certainly been no exception. On the 15th of March, we had the single biggest "non-special day" attendance in AT LEAST the last SEVERAL years- 269 people. And that, for my money, is awesome!

But the other typical trend churches follow is that AFTER Easter...worship attendance tends to drop like a baseball rolling off the edge of a table. And that's where that theme song comes in! What will WE do "the morning after"? Will we embrace the trend and watch attendance drop, chalking it up to "that's normal"? OR- will we choose to BUCK that trend and stay committed to our stated mission of connecting people to Jesus Christ?

I have said since the moment the Harris family walked in the door that God is doing something special at the Aledo UMC. And I still hold firmly to that fact. And this "season" after Easter 2015 is a watershed event for us in that respect. If we embrace the "fact" of a drop in attendance, then we will do just fine from here until Fall. We will average a bit over 200 a week during that time. AND we will struggle, month to month, to meet our budget and cover our expenses. And the whole time, we will look toward the fact that Fall is coming.

OR we can refuse to accept that God takes a vacation from our lives, We can embrace the amazing gift that God is giving us- a church that is growing and flourishing in the midst of a climate of church decline- and joyfully continue what we are already doing through May, June, July and August. What God is doing here is special and unique. It is NOT the norm for most pastors and most churches. We are in the middle of a blessing from God that nearly every other church in the country would LOVE to experience. I can't wait to see what can happen over the next four months by staying fully engaged in the life of AUMC! Who's with me?!

# **NEW SERMON SERIES(S)!**

On Sunday, April 12th, we begin not one but TWO new sermon series!

At the two Sunday morning worship services, we will seek a renewed understanding of what it means to be United Methodist as we look at **The Greatest Story Never Told**. Based on the book by author (and United Methodist minister) Leonard Sweet, this series asks the question, "What makes a United Methodist?" The essence of United Methodism's genius is found in two famous John Wesley phrases; "heart strangely warmed" (inward experiences with a fire in the heart) and "the world is our parish" (outward experiences with waterfalls of cutting-edge intelligence). For Wesley, internal combustion led to external combustion. The weeks of the series look like this:

- Sunday, April 12- <u>The Song of Water</u> (Romans 6:1-5) Lift Up Your Voice With Strength. (Ezekiel 36:24-26, Romans 6:1-5)
- Sunday, April 19- <u>The Song of Fire</u> (Philippians 4:11b-13) Hearts Strangely Warmed (Psalm 73:25-26, John 14:12)
- Sunday, April 26- <u>The Song of Wind</u> (Acts 1:4-8) Life in the Spirit (Zechariah 4:6, John 14:25-26)
- Sunday, May 3- <u>The Song of Earth</u> (Matthew 28:16-20) The World is Our Parish (Jeremiah 29:11-13, Matthew 10:5-8)

At the Sunday evening Point service, we will look at a three-week sermon series called **Three D.O.T.S.** (Difficult Old Testament Stories). These three stories are among the hardest Bible stories to understand. We will walk through them, see WHY they're so hard and what they might mean for us. The weeks of the series look like this:

- Sunday, April 12- <u>Don't Poke the Bald Guy</u> (2Kings 2:23-25) Sy Sperling Gets Revenge?
- Sunday, April 19- <u>A Donkey Talks</u> (Number 22:21-33) We hear straight from the...donkey's mouth!
- Sunday, April 26- <u>You Want Me to Do WHAT?!</u> (Genesis 22:1-14) God asks Abraham for the WORST possible thing. Come each week expecting God to make...and keep His promises to you!

# LADDER SAFETY

#### From Your AUMC Safety Team – We care about you and your safety

**Spring Cleaning** time is here – washing windows, cleaning gutters, painting, etc. – all tasks that involve LADDERS! We all get busy and don't pay close attention to what we're doing. Take the time to be safe on a ladder.

Inspect your ladder. Are there broken rungs or damaged rails?

Clean the rungs of any grease or other foreign substances.

There should be non-skid shoes on all ladders.

The ladder should not be wobbly when set up.

Don't use metal ladders around electrical equipment or wires.


Place ladder on a firm foundation. Don't put it up on boxes or other supports.

- Position your ladder properly. It should extend one foot away from the wall for every four feet of height. It should have three rungs above the top point at which you want to work.
- Look around to see if there are doorways where people might come through and accidentally bump your ladder.

Don't use a stepladder as a straight ladder.

Climb the ladder holding on with both hands.




#### Easter Ransom

### **INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT JESUS**

There are so many amazing and interesting facts in the Bible. Check out this list of interesting facts about Jesus.

1. <u>His Name</u>- Jesus is the English transliteration of the Greek name Iesus. Joshua is the English transliteration of the Hebrew name Yeshuah. Both Jesus and Joshua mean "Yahweh saves" or "Jehovah is salvation". The name Jesus appears in the Bible more than 900 times.

2. <u>The Title "Christ"</u>- Christ is not a name, but a title. When the Bible talks about the Messiah, it's referring to the same title as Christ. Both Messiah and Christ mean "anointed one". The word Christ appears in the Bible more than 500 times.

3. Jesus' Titles For Himself- Jesus said He was "the bread of life" and "the living bread". He was "the light of the world", "the good shepherd", "the Son of God" and "the Son of man". He also said He was "the way, the truth and the life".

4. <u>Foods Jesus Ate</u>- Jesus ate bread and "clean meats" such as lamb and fish. The Old Testament says He would eat butter and honey. Luke says He ate broiled fish and honeycomb after His resurrection.

5. <u>Jesus' Birthday</u>- Although celebrated on December 25, the Bible doesn't say when His birthday was. Various scholars have put it sometime in late winter or early spring. There's no record of early Christians celebrating His birth.

6. <u>Jesus and John the Baptist</u>- John the Baptist was Jesus' second cousin. Mary (Jesus' mother) and Elisabeth (John's mother) were cousins. John was about 6 months older than Jesus.

7. Jesus' Family- Jesus had several half-brothers and sisters.



### WAYS CHURCHES DRIVE AWAY FIRST-TIME GUESTS

If you attend a church regularly, you've probably noticed the phenomenon. A guest shows up for a worship service, but he never returns. It's a fairly common issue in many churches. A recent survey sheds some light on why that is. Here are the reasons first-time guests gave as to why they chose not to return to a particular church.

- 1. Unfriendly church members. This response was anticipated. But the surprise was the number of respondents who included non-genuine friendliness in their answers. In other words, the guests perceived some of the church members were faking it.
- 2. Unsafe and unclean children's area. This response generated the greatest emotional reactions. If your church does not give a high priority to children, don't expect young families to attend.
- 3.Bad church website. Most of the church guests went to the church website before they attended a worship service. Even if they attended the service after visiting a bad website, they attended with a prejudicial perspective. The two indispensable items guests want on a website are address and times of service. It's just that basic.
- 4. Poor signage. If you have been attending a church for a few weeks, you forget all about the signage. You don't need it any more. But guests do. And they are frustrated when it's not there.
- 5. Insider church language. Most of the respondents were not referring to theological language as much as language that only the members know.
- 6.Boring or bad service.
- 7. Members telling guests that they were in their seat or pew. Yes, this obviously still takes place in some churches.
- 8. Dirty facilities. Some of the comments: "Didn't look like it had been cleaned in a week." "No trash cans anywhere." Restrooms were worse than a bad truck stop." "Pews had more stains than a Tide commercial."

There you have it. Eight reasons first-time guests said they didn't return to a church! How do we rank?
