



LOOKING BACK: AS I REMEMBER ... AND FROM NOTES ALONG THE WAY.

(The final instalment of the memories of Merna Gates from Brunswick Beach, submitted to LBHS in 1983)

The highway was opened in 1958 — the construction blown off roofs, etc. etc. The roof of Thoms company working this section of the road was Campbell & was blown over top of their house, taking ch Bennett. In 1959 there was a rumour that Black Ball Ferries were going to make terminal at Brunswick Beach!! Plans were started to install water system, and in the summer of 1960 an intake pool was made; plastic pipe came down bank of creek, under the highway bridge. Each property owner had to have an 18" trench dug across the back of his property by May 31st 1960. Pipe was laid and trenches had to be filled by September 1st.

In 1960 Deeks Creek Logging Co. made application for foreshore lease off mouth of Magnesia Creek. Also in 1960, Peter Kiewit Construction Co. placed mobile homes on road allowance and Government Lot 13, Blk. 19. They had their gravel works on the railway property. Electricity came to us in 1960.
