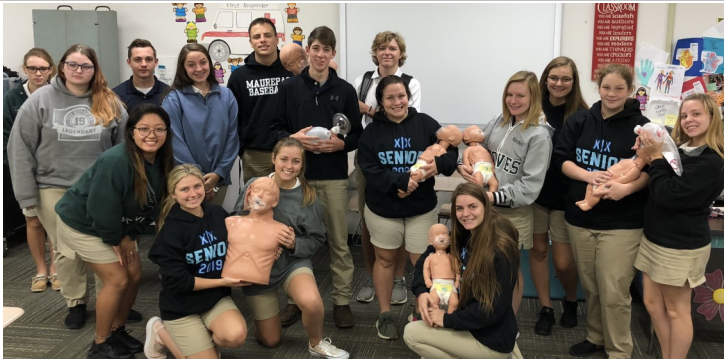

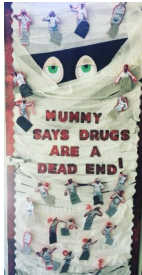
JAMBOREE
