

Carlo Acutis: The First Millennial Saint by Nicola Gori



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children



Today marks the end of the Easter Season. It is the birthday of the church. Today we celebrate the gift that Jesus gave us, the gift of the Holy Spirit. Father wears red today because it

is the color of fire and we often think of fire and the Holy Spirit together.

What do you think of when you think of fire?

In the first reading we hear of tongues of fire that came to rest on the apostles.

The Holy Spirit is also like wind. What does wind do?

After the resurrection. Jesus appeared to his friends and said. "Receive the Holy Spirit." When he said this, he breathed on them. We cane feel someone's breath even when we can't see it. Wind can't be held in your hands but it can move things. Wind can sometimes be very powerful and strong. Over time, wind can wear down mountains. Wind from tornadoes and hurricanes leave damaging effects.

On Pentecost, the disciples experienced this kind of strong, powerful wind. In the Acts of the Apostles, it was described as sounding like a strong, driving wind. Immediately, the disciples felt the effect of the Holy Spirit and were moved to act. They began to speak of the mighty acts of God. The disciples left the upper room and went throughout the known world at that time, spreading the Good News of Jesus.

In the second reading we hear that everyone has been giving gifts from God. We are to use those gifts to help ourselves and others get to heaven.

Living our Faith: What are some of the gifts that God has given to you. How will you use them this week to help others see the goodness of God in you?








Pentecost Collection
