MCPS Kindergarten Registration is Happening Now!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

When contacting your local elementary school ask if they are hosting any informational kindergarten meetings for parents. These events are a great way to learn more about your child's transition to your neighborhood school.



IMPORTANT NEWS FOR BHPCNS FAMILIES

Financial Aid Requests for 20172018 School Year:

If you are in need of financial aid for next school year, the paperwork can be found on the BHPCNS website under tuition or by <u>clicking here</u>. Applications for financial aid are due April 1, 2017 and will be reviewed at the BHPCNS April Finance Committee meeting. Applicants will be notified shortly thereafter. Please contact the office if you have any questions.

Lotions and Medications:

BHPCNS cannot administer lotions, creams, medications, to your child without a medical directive from your child's doctor. This includes prescription and non-prescription medicals. If you'd like more details, contact Liz or Carolyn in the office.

Sick Kids: Over the past few weeks children in our program have been diagnosed with strep throat, flu, conjunctivitis, and other communicable diseases. If your child is ill, running a fever, throwing up, has pink eye, etc. they may not return to school until they have been symptom free for 24 hours. If your child requires Tylenol or Motrin to keep their fever down to attend school, they MAY NOT be at school until they have been fever free, without medication for 24 hours.

Lunch at BHPCNS: Just a reminder that the State of Maryland Department of Education requires us to put out a child's lunch in its entirety. If your child has a cookie or a piece of candy in their lunch bag we are not allowed to tell them to eat their healthy foods first. If you would like your child to eat their "growing" foods first, I'd suggest saving the treat until after school.

Monday: The Artist's Corner By Mrs. McCullough Art Stay and Play in the month of April will head into SPRING! Nature will be our muse. 


FUN FRIDAYS with Ms. Allen and Mrs. Leon in March will be going green!

Music with Mr. Chip 2s, 3s, & 4s

Mr. Chip Reports:

As we have proceeded into our new curriculum, Sing Me A Story, we have had some fun with different activities related to Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star. Several classes enjoyed learning that this song was written by Mozart and was based in part on a French folk tune. Perhaps the best part of this discussion was the fact that the original words weren't about the stars, but were about candy! The original folk tune translates as,

Ah! Let me tell you, Mother, What's the cause of my torment? Papa wants me to reason Like a grown-up. Me, I say that candy has Greater value than reason.

It's hard to argue with that reason. As we move into March, we will transition to activities related to Hickory Dickory Dock. We will follow sounds up and down like the mouse in the clock, and will play a movement game involving cats and mice. We will also use Zoltan Kodaly's "Viennese Musical Clock" (from the Hary Janos Suite) as a foundation for moving in various ways while following the form of the music. As always, we will sing and dance and play, and I am sure the kids will continue to come up with new ideas for me to try!

Mrs. Sutherland reports:

We'll be taking a lot of deep breaths in Science this month as we focus on the topic of air and wind! Through observations, the children will discover that even though we can't see it, air is everywhere and it takes up space. They will learn that all living things need air and that without it, people would have to carry tanks of air around with them like astronauts and scuba divers. They will become familiar with how the plants and trees help us by providing us with the good air (oxygen) that we need. The children will discover that moving air is wind which can be as gentle as our breaths or as strong as a hurricane. We will have a lot of fun experimenting with wind!

Mrs. Stevens Reports:

This month in Creative Movement we will continue our parachute play. The children will bounce monkeys on the parachute to the song <u>Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed</u>. We will also shake barnyard animals on the parachute to <u>Old McDonald Had a Farm</u>. As spring is quickly approaching, the children will fly like ladybugs, birds, and butterflies to the song, <u>Spring is here</u>. They will also enjoy driving the fire truck, climbing the ladder, and squirting the water to their favorite song, <u>Hurry</u>, <u>Hurry</u>, <u>Drive the Firetruck</u>.

Mrs. Cardoni Reports:

This month in Spanish we continue to review vocabulary on feelings (sentimientos) and our body (el cuerpo). We will learn how to talk about our daily routine and what we choose to wear each day depending on the weather; wake up in the morning and get up out of bed (me despierto y me levanto de la cama) and then wash for the day and get dressed; "I put on my shirt, I put on my socks"-"Me pongo la camisa, me pongo los calcetines." Toward the end of the month we will start learning the names for all types of animals and sing the Itsy Bitsy Araña and Los Pollitos. We're looking forward to reading Harry the Dirty Dog in Spanish; Harry El Perrito Sucio by Gene Zion. We continue to review colors, body parts (we danced the Hokey Pokey in Spanish!), food, numbers, days of the week and the four seasons. We can't wait for Spring- La Primavera!!!
