History of the World (Part II)

Rounding out our very quick glance at the history of the region is a summary of the empires and cultures of the ancient world. The history that overlaps with the narrative of the Old Testament covers everything from the time just after the Akkadian Empire's collapse through the wars between the Achaemenids of Persia and Argeads under Alexander. To put it in numbers, this is from around the year 2200 BC through the 400s BC. A lot of change happens, especially in the region of the Holy Land. Understanding the geography helps to keep some of this history straight.

But these empires and cultures are very influential to the happenings we read about in the Old Testament.
