Tickets Available for Annual Fashion Show


The women of the Optimist Club of Perdido Bay will host the annual Luncheon and Fashion Show on Saturday, July 27, in the Lillian Community Club.







If there are a few residents who would be interested in repairing and staining some of our picnic tables, we would welcome your time and talent.


Movie and Music in the Park is the first Friday of the month and on June 7 we will be showing "Dolphin Tale." Our movies are family friendly, free and fun.



What to Know About Termite Coverage

Termite swarm season is around us again. They are a necessary part of the ecosystem. Termites do the very important work of returning trees to soil. You know what termites eat for breakfast, don't you? Oak-meal!

There is something major afoot in the pest control industry. One of the big companies has decided to redo its business model and is sending out letters to their customer doubling, and sometimes tripling, the termite renewal fee.

Let's face it - termites are a major problem in Alabama. In fact, that company released a report in March 2017 naming Alabama, Florida and Texas as areas of the worst termite activity in the nation. In our part of Alabama, it is not if you get termites, it is when and how badly the house is infested.

Termites do over \$5 billion dollars in damage to homes every year in the U.S. Homeowner's insurance policies do not cover termites. That's why it is important to get coverage with a reputable termite company.

Back to these letters, what should you do as a consumer? What are your options when a company triples your renewal? Well, sadly, your options are limited.

First, you could choose to pay the ridiculous fee. If you have a repair warranty, that might be a good idea, especially if you have a repair warranty situation going on right

now. In order to keep the repairs going until they are finished, you may have to pay the renewal fee. If you want to double check, you may want to call the Department of Agriculture and Industries – Pesticide Management Division at (334) 240-7100 or (800) 642-7761, or send them an email at ask-me@agi.alabama.gov.

Termite coverage is very specific – only the company that currently holds your termite coverage will do warranty repair work. It is critical to determine if you have an active termite situation going on before you try to change companies. You would not want to jeopardize your warranty coverage on your home by prematurely getting another termite company involved.

Another option is to get quotes from other companies to change your coverage. The problem with that plan is that it will still be expensive. The costliest part of any termite warranty is the initial application of whatever treatment plan your termite company offers.

For our part, we use a liquid applied termiticide called Termidor 80 WG or Termidor HP. If you call to make an appointment for an estimate, we are scheduling a couple of weeks out.

If you were an international termite company, and 90% of your liability was coming from one particular area, say the states along

the Gulf of Mexico, you might look for ways to reduce the responsibilities in that area.

The bottom line is termites can cause you thousands of dollars in damages if you don't have a warranty. It often costs less to treat your home against termite invasions than it does to paint it. Should you have a termite problem that requires repairs, those costs can quickly rack up much higher than a yearly termite warranty renewal fee.

There are a few things that you can do: Trim all shrubbery near home exteriors to allow airflow and quickly dry damp areas. Use products such as synthetic mulch or pea gravel when landscaping.





HERB CRUSTED PORK TENDERLOIN

WITH **HORSERADISH**

SAUCE



INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/2 lb. pork tenderloin
- 2 Tb dijon mustard

- chopped
- 1/2 tsp paprika · 1 tsp kosher salt
- **HORSERADISH SAUCE**
- 2 Tb olive oil
- 3 whole garlic cloves, minced 1/4 cup prepared horseradish
- 1 Tb fresh thyme, chopped 1 Tb fresh rosemary, finely
- 1/2 t black pepper

DIRECTIONS

- · Rinse pork tenderloin under cool water, pat dry with paper towels, and place in a plastic storage bag or container.
- · Make marinade. Mix mustard, olive oil, garlic, thyme, rosemary, paprika pepper & salt in a small bowl until well combined. Pour over pork and ensure it is well coated.
- · Allow to marinate for at least 20 minutes or in the refrigerator for up to 24 hours.
- Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Place pork on a sheet pan lined with aluminum foil. Roast for 35 minutes until internal temperature reaches 145 degrees. Allow to rest for 10 minutes before slicing.
- Serve with Horseradish Sauce: Combine sour cream, horseradish, lemon juice, vinegar, paprika and salt until well combined.


