From the Principal's Desk

Influences: Past and Present

I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lives in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also.. 2 Timothy 1:5

Who or what are the major influences in the lives of children today? TV? Smart phone? Video Games? Friends? What about your children? Who or what influences them? Has the list changed? If so, how? Actors? Musicians? Sports Figures? What about you? That's right you, the parent. Do you realize what an influence you are in your child's life?

It's really important that we see things from God's point of view, especially as we begin a new school year. Throughout scripture, God says to us that the parents are to be the primary educator in the child's life. They are to be the ones that raise their children, not the smart phone, Hollywood, or the latest fad.

If you choose to not follow the school bus rules of the road, you may get a ticket from the police department. School bus drivers can report you to the police department. CEF Stamps

Each Friday morning we will be selling Church Extension Fund (CEF) stamps to the children for \$1.00 each. The stamps will be sold from 7:35-7:55 A.M. starting Friday, September 6th. Please see Mrs. Leissring to purchase stamps. The primary purpose of WELS CEF is to make loans to mission-minded endeavors (projects) under the direction of the Board for Home Missions. These loans are used to acquire parsonages, land sites, and ministry facilities as tools for Gospel outreach. WELS members and WELS congregations can invest in WELS CEF to help support the church loan programs.

The CEF stamp program is a savings account where the money is invested in building churches and parsonages for mission congregations. The children earn interest from their savings just like a regular bank account. Why not have your child start an account and help out a mission church at the same time?

Teach Children School Bus Safety

In many ways, today's children are luckier than those of past generations. For example, because a bus picks them up, they don't have to walk a long distance to get to school.

Riding the bus is safer for kids than walking and crossing street on their own, but there are bus-related safety issues that parents need to stress:

- Have children put everything they carry into a backpack or school bag so they | won't drop anything.
- Be sure they leave on time so they don't have to run for the bus.
- Go to the bus stop with young children. Have older kids walk in groups so they
 can easily be seen by drivers.
- Don't let children play games or push and shove at the bus stop.
- Make sure they stand six feet from the road while waiting.
- Teach them to secure loose drawstrings and other objects that could get caught in the handrail or door of the bus when they are leaving.
- If they must cross the street when exiting the bus, remind them to wait until the driver signals that it's safe.
- If they drop something near the bus, they should tell the bus driver and follow the driver's instructions.
- Remind them that when they are on the bus, they should talk quietly, be courteous to the bus driver, and follow the driver's directions.
- Insist that children keep the aisles clear and stay seated for the entire ride.
