Next Press Deadline March 26, 2017 he season of Lent began on March
1st. Lent comes from an Old English
word that means "the season of
Spring" and refers to the 45 day period of
time leading up to the celebration of the
resurrection of Jesus. In the protestant
Christian tradition, Lent is a time for
reflection and focus upon our relationship
with Jesus. It is a season for recalling the
events of the last week of Jesus' ministry
– his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, the



final observance of the Passover meal with his disciples, his arrest, trial and crucifixion, and his resurrection.

During this season of Lent, my Sunday messages will focus on prayer. Prayer is an essential part of our relationship with God because it is the means through which we connect with our Creator and experience deep, rich communion. Prayer begins with adoration, praise and thanksgiving. Adoration then moves us to repentance and confession of our sins. From there we can rightly enter into a conversation in which we speak to God about our needs and the needs of others and in which we listen to God with a humble heart, ready to respond in obedience. During this season of Lent I encourage you to find time – or make time – to focus in prayer.

I believe it is important for us to have this prayer focus because we are in a season of time in the life of Trinity Church that is very crucial to its future, and we must seek God's guidance and discover God's intentions for this future.

One element in this mix is that the Session, with permission from the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM), has approved hiring me as a ¾ time provider of Pastoral Ministry Services. This means that beginning March 5th I will be able to supervise and support our staff team, give guidance to and work closely with the Session and ministry teams, work with the worship planning team, support the Deacons, and provide increased pastoral care.

The next step would be for the COM to approve an Interim Pastor for Trinity. I have asked to be considered for this role and the COM is evaluating and working on that request. Please pray for wisdom and discernment about this – for an outcome that will best serve Trinity.

So, please join me in praying for Trinity Church. Ask God to draw us closer to himself, to strengthen our resolve to trust in and honor our Lord Jesus, and to fill us with God's Holy Spirit so that we are led and given courage to follow our Lord into the future planned for us.

KATIE BIANCHINI – LEARNING TO SERVE JESUS AND OTHERS IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

As Interim Missions/Outreach Director, Rebecca DeBreau receives updates on missionaries. She hopes to highlight missionaries who are part of this church directly and indirectly from time to time.

This month she would like to introduce you to Katie Bianchini. Kate is the granddaughter of Jim and Carolyn Baker. She is a senior at Lipscomb University (a small Christian college) in Nashville, TN. The school has a department of missions, and various campus groups do short-term mission projects every year. She is on the cross country and track teams, and for the last several years, they have gone on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic (DR). The article below is from her latest adventure this past December.

From her newsletter:

ur group and our college friends who live in Santiago, DR had walked around their neighborhood inviting everyone to a feast at the house. My team of five probably invited around 30 people and I imagine the other groups had done the same. However, we didn't know how many people to expect, so we prepared for 70 guests.

A little background on Dominican culture: nothing runs on time. Our dinner was supposed to start at 7:00 p.m., so we expected people to arrive around 8 p.m. When Glenn, our DR-based point-person, and I parked at the house at 6:40 p.m., we saw 30 adults and children in the yard already. We knew nothing would go as we had expected.

At seven o'clock, we began filling plates. I stood at the pot of beans, ladling generous scoops for the guests outside. Reports came in from servers that far more than 70 people had arrived. The serving line became hectic. "Go faster! There's lots of people to serve!" "How much rice should I put on each plate?!" "Is this already the last of the potato salad?"

Usually in situations like these (a) I feel stressed, (b) I get fearful that we won't have enough to go around, and (c), the big one - I take a vocal leadership role, directing traffic and calling shots. That day, not so. I was overwhelmed with a sense of peace.

I continued spooning the same amount of beans onto each plate, a gentle whisper saying to me, "Ask for exactly what you need and I will give you exactly enough." The stories in the Bible I'd just read danced through my mind. When I'd read them, I had thought they were pretty cool, but almost a little too good to be true. Nonetheless, I stood silently in the chaotic room, repeating to God, "We don't have enough food here. We need exactly enough."

I emptied the first pot of beans just as someone announced the arrival of a new crowd. "Exactly enough. We need exactly enough. Here's our problem, Lord. Take it in your hands." The room reeled. More panic, more questions. Servers flew in and out of the door as we blindly filled plates for the large crowd outside.



"We're out of plates and silverware." From somewhere, more appeared! I ladled the last scoop of beans into the bowl in my hands.

Suddenly.

"Stop. Everyone has food."

We looked at each other in utter surprise. We estimated, based on the number of cups we'd purchased, that we'd served 175-200 people. I still said nothing as my friends began celebrating. It's like I couldn't say anything ... and as a communication major, I've been trained not to be at a loss for words.

Ples Felix from the Tariq
Khamisa Foundation will be our
speaker. The Tariq Khamisa
Foundation (TKF) is a San Diego
nonprofit with the mission to
educate and inspire children
in the restorative principles of
accountability, compassion,
forgiveness, peacemaking
and support for safer schools
and communities.

TKF was established in 1995 after Tariq Khamisa, a 20-yearold college student was killed by Tony Hicks, a 14-year-old gang member. Tony became the first child in California under the age of 16 to be convicted as an adult. He was sentenced to 25 years to life in prison. Believing there were "victims on both ends of the gun", Tarig's father, Azim Khamisa, reached out in forgiveness to Tony's grandfather, Ples Felix, to begin the process of healing; together they established TKF. Ples will share that inspiring journey.
