#### LANCASTER-FAIRFIELD PUBLIC TRANSIT IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Exciting news to announce. They will be piloting a new service in Pickerington and Violet Township. As of October 1<sup>st</sup>, LFPT will be offering deviated-fixed routes in addition to their demand response service. This means there will be hourly loops running (one north, one south). These two loops will meet in three locations to transfer passengers, between the routes. No reservations required.

- 1. It's a set schedule that will not change.
- The fare is only \$ .50 for general public or \$ .25 for mobility program passengers.
- If you don't have access to the route, they can deviate up to ¾ of a mile to still pick you up at The cheaper fare!
