

Compliance Corner

Important Notices:

Check all sides of your house and shed for dirt and mold. Clean, power wash and paint if needed. Exterior surfaces must be kept clean and maintained, as stated in our documents.

- 2) Parking is not permitted in the front yard of your home, unless it is a prepared surface of concrete, rock aggregate, or crushed shell - and must be weed free. Parking is permitted on the side of your home and grass area between the street and sidewalk.
- Rainy season is almost here which means lawn cutting and trimming more often. Please be sure that you or your lawn care person maintains your property on a regular basis.



Attention Swimmers!!



Reminders for residents that use the community Pools:

1) Pool opens at 8:30 am – pool closes ½ hour before sunset. Closing times are posted.

2) No Alcohol is permitted at either of the pool areas.

3) No Food or Drink is allowed on the pool deck except water in non-glass containers.

4) Food is permitted on the upper deck at the

Rec Center pool only.

5) Noodles and foam exercise equipment only. No floaties, toys, balls etc.

6) Radios and other such devices must be used with headphones.

7) No running, diving, back flips. No horseplay or profanity.

8) Proper attire is required. at both pools.

9) Please close the table umbrellas upon

leaving.

10) Be aware of the **WeatherBug** early warning system. When lightning is detected within 10 miles a single long horn blast (similar to a car horn) goes off and a strobe light illuminates at both pools. This means the Pools are Closed and you must leave the Pool and deck area. Pools remain closed while the strobes are lit. Once the all clear is given (three horn blasts and the strobe lights go out) the pools are then open. You can also load the WeatherBug app on your smart phone or check WeatherBug.com

Please obey these common-safety rules at both pools!

National Hurricane Preparedness Week is May 5 – 11

Get ready for Hurricane season, June 1 through November 30.

1) Tune in for regular weather updates on local stations, EAS or NOAA.

2) Check & replenish your disaster supplies,

including first aid kit.

3) Have a portable radio, camera and battery supplies on hand.

4) Gather emergency chargers such as battery

packs or solar-powered alternatives.

5) Stock enough food to feed your household for 3-7 days, especially pantry items that don't require cooking or refrigeration.

6) Have gallons and cases of bottled water for drinking and cooking.

7) Charcoal or propane for emergency cooking

- outdoors only.

8) Fill bathtubs and sinks for extra clean water.

9) Get bags of Ice to fill coolers, empty buckets with lids.

10) Don't forget the needs of your pets.

11) Clear your yard of lawn furniture, potted plants, bicycles, and other potential airborne missiles. Secure your boat and any other large items on property.

12) Fill your vehicle's gas tank, check fluids and

tires.

- 13) Get enough cash out in case banks and ATM's are closed.
- 14) Be sure you have at least a two-week supply of medications.

15) Install storm shutters or plywood to protect

your windows and glass doors.

16) If time permits clear your drains, gutters. Never sweep clippings, debris or soil into the street as it can clog up the stormwater pipes and prevent drainage.

17) If there is a risk of flooding, move important items and electronics off the floor in your home.

Put important documents in a safe place.

18) Know your Zone color, evacuation route, shelter locations, FEMA safe room or ICC 500 storm shelter. The next best protection is a small, interior, windowless room in a sturdy building on the lowest level not subject to flooding.

19) Using a shelter should be a last resort. Depending on the location, many shelters may not be able to be open, depending on the severity. Call 211 (official information during emergencies) to

find out which shelters may be open.

20) If told to evacuate - do so immediately, let friends and relatives know where you are going.

21) If flooding threatens your home, turn off

electricity at the main breaker.

22) If you lose power, turn off major appliances such as the A/C and water heater to reduce damage from surge when power is restored.

23) Use flashlights and lanterns instead of

candles.

24) Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters. Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.

25) Do not allow children to play in or near water, storm drains or ditches. Flood waters may be contaminated with oil, gasoline or raw sewage.

26) Be aware-snakes, alligators & other animals

are driven to higher ground by flooding

27) Use a generator or other gasoline-powered machinery ONLY outdoors and away from windows.

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


