

## **Kamloops Vibe News for 2014 – 2015 season**

### **April 13 2015**

With a short 10 player bench, and only 2 regular defense-men, the Kamloops Vibe played as a alternate team for Saskatchewan in the Western Shield in Stonewall Manitoba. Saskatchewan was unable to field a team this year.

After traveling all day Thursday the Vibe hit the ice against the Grande Prairie Panthers. Following a scoreless first period Jenna Ormondy scored midway through the second on a power-play from Alyssa Reid and Emily Edmundson. The Panthers tied the game at the end of the period, outplaying the Alberta champs, the Vibe ran out of gas for a 1-1 final score.

Friday Kamloops was up against a strong Manitoba Prairie Fire team. Alyssa Reid scored first, 5 minutes left in the first, assisted by Emily and Jenna. Manitoba tied the game with 48 seconds left. Manitoba took the lead early in the second with Jenna tying it up early in the third period, assist by Rochelle Smith. The Fire scored twice more for the 4-2 win. The Prairie Fire ended up winning the B side of the tournament.

Friday evening the team was back on the ice taking on the host ACC Cougars. Once again the Vibe got on the board first on a goal from Alyssa assisted by Rochelle. The Cougars scored 3 unanswered goals for the win.

Saturday Kamloops took on the South Fraser TNT. The TNT scored first early in the game with Emily evening the score 2 minutes later on a n assist from Melinda Smith. Lisa Campeau gave the Vibe the lead late in the period assisted by Catriona Young and Rochelle. The TNT tied the game in the second with a game winner in the third.

In the B side of the Western Shield, Manitoba Prairie Fire took Gold, Grande Prairie Panthers Silver, ACC Cougars Bronze

Alana Parker earned 2 game MVP's for her outstanding play in net for Kamloops.

## March 30

The Provincial weekend started Friday evening for the Vibe with a 5-1 win over the Fraser Valley Jets. the Jets got on the board first with 5 minutes left in the first with Alyssa Reid tying the game 3 minutes later for Kamloops, assisted by Emily Edmundson and Jenna Ormondy. Rochelle Smith scored the game winner with 17 seconds left in the first, assist from Melinda Smith. After a scoreless second period, Kamloops scored 3 unanswered goals from Lisa Campeau, Rochelle, and Elaine Topolniski with assists from Courtney Morice, Elaine and Melinda.

Saturday morning the Vibe were back on the ice for a match against the Richmond Devils. After a scoreless first period the Devils scored with 2 minutes left in the second to take a 1-0 lead into the final period. Rochelle Smith scored unassisted, on a powerplay, midway through. Courtney Morice got the game winner with 5 minutes left, assisted by Alyssa and Bianca Mirabelli. With this win the Vibe clinched top spot in Pool A and got a by into the semi-finals.

Sunday morning Kamloops and the Jets were back on the ice for a semi-final re-match. The teams played 3 periods of scoreless hockey, with the Vibe out-shooting the Jets by a margin on 32-13. After a 5 minute 4 on 4 overtime in which the Vibe out-shot the jets 6-1, the game went into a shoot-out. After 4 shooters the tally was 2-1 for Kamloops, The jets tied on their last shot with Desiree Blair scoring over the blocker for the win and a spot in the final game. The first time in league history for a game to be decided in OT to get into the final. Alana Parker earned her 17 shut-out of the season.

A short 3 hours later the Vibe were back on the ice to take on the undefeated South Fraser TNT in the Championship game. 10 minutes into the game Kamloops got on the board first with a goal by Alyssa Reid assisted by Desiree Blair. Midway through the second the TNT tied the game on a short handed goal. Six minutes into the final period the TNT scored the game winner to take the Provincial Championship Title, stopping the 4 year run by Kamloops. Shots for the final game were 32-30 for the TNT.

With the Provincial title the TNT earned a spot in the Western Shield Championships in Stonewall, Manitoba April 9-12. The Vibe will also go to the Westerns as Saskatchewan is unable to field a team.
