- o Twister- Spacing route Hitch & Pitch
- Deal- Behind the back Rollout Draw
- Bench Lighting- Double move on Rollout
- o HBO
- o Letter Screen: Triple screen
- o "Big" Outtie
- o Oreo: Double Pass/Throwback Screen
- o Oro: Sweep Reverse, throwback to QB
- o Oregon: Sweep Reverse off audible action
- o "Ones": When/why QB sneak, using cadence as a weapon
- o Rooskie: Counter to the QB sneak
- Rooster: Shotgun version of fumblerooskie
- Outtie Picket: For the athletic QB
- o Flipper: Clutch down play, from Coach Kevin Kelley
- o Hide It/Do It: First sound, great after 1st Down
- Quads Naked: Hash 2-point conversion play, Pass/Run/Pass Option
- o El Nino: WR hide play, disguise with motion
