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FALL INTO WINTER JACKET

Approximately 3000 yards of fingering weight yarn
Knitting needles (yarn and needles to be determined in first session)

This eye catching jacket is knit side to side in a half linen stitch, holding 2 strands of fingering weight yarn together. In the first session we will design the jacket to fit, knit a swatch and then determine the quantity and type of yarn to purchase. Yarn cost can be as inexpensive or costly as you decide. The sample is knit using several variegated yarns to create a gradient effect, lighter at the wrist and darker in the center. Every student will end up with a one of a kind jacket!
