GROWING IN GOD'S WISDOM

1Sam. 3:3-10, 19; Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-10; 1Cor. 6: 13-15, 17-20; John 1:35-42

People often asked me: "Did you always know you were going to be a priest?" "How did you know you were called to be a priest?" "What made you decide to become a priest?" The simple answer is that I did not always know that I was going to be priest. In fact, I never planned to become a priest. I decided to become a priest after my rector in Junior Seminary (High School) spoke to us in our senior year about the different groups of priests in the Catholic Church – the diocesan – the religious/consecrated – the society of apostolic life / missionary. He was our mentor! My encounter with him clicked-on the light bulb in my head about a vocation to the priesthood. To put it in proper perspective, I was just seventeen years old – ignorant, immature, innocent and timid. I may not have been aware or I may not have had the humility to admit it, but I needed some guidance. Don't we all? "Here am I, Lord; I come to do Your will."

This past Monday, we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. Thus, it is not surprising that the scripture readings of this Sunday focus primarily on discipleship. It is a sign that our ordinary lives unfold as a following of Christ. Christ's Baptism reminds us of our baptism and the call to discipleship. The theme of call and response to discipleship permeates today's scripture readings – the first reading tells us of the young boy, Samuel, who was called while asleep. He did not realize Who called him. He mistook the caller for the priest, Eli. But it was indeed God Who called the boy. Guided by Eli, Samuel responded to the caller: "Speak Lord, Your servant is listening." With that response, the Bible tells us that: "Samuel grew up, and the Lord was with him..." Guided by the wisdom of a priest, led by the experience of an adult and tutored by the knowledge of a guardian, the little boy, Samuel, came to discover the presence of God. He came to realize that it was the Lord Who called him, and he responded positively.

The gospel reading also induces a call to discipleship. John the Baptist pointed Jesus out to his disciples who out of mere curiosity inquired of Jesus: "Rabbi, Teacher where are You staying?" Jesus said to them: "Come, and you will see." They were not satisfied that they had seen Him. They wanted to experience and to study Him – to be with Him – to learn from Him – to understand the demands of discipleship. Thus, they went and stayed with Jesus the whole day. After their encounter with Jesus, Andrew, sought his brother, Simon, and said to him: "We have found the Messiah!" And he later brought Simon and introduced him to Jesus. This year, is declared, "A Year of Re-evangelization" in our parish. You and I are tasked to reach out to lapsed Catholics those who have left the Church because of one reason or another. We are urged to bring Christ to those who do not know Him. Last Sunday was "bring-a-friend Sunday" in our parish. Like Andrew, you who have experience Christ in the Eucharist – in the Word – in the Church, are asked to bring others to Him and to bring Him to others.

As leaders – priests, teachers, catechists, parents, and/or guardians, you and I have a responsibility just like Eli to direct and guide our young people to the Lord by our words and examples. Through the direction and wisdom of good role models, young people need to discover what the Lord is calling them to do in life; and we must help them respond to it positively. Since "the body is a temple of the Holy Spirit...from God," you and I have the responsibility to use it primarily in service of God. Parents should generously cooperate if their child feels he/she has received God's invitation to live a meaningful life of dedication in a vocation to priesthood or religious life. Ask the Lord to "Speak, for Your servant is listening!"
