- The plant at this time is using 2 of its 3 blowers to take care of oxidation, and mixing of the treatment basin. It has been determined that we have an airline that is leaking under the concrete drive. If we get this grant we can update our blowers and get the air leak fixed.
- Project will cost approximately \$300,000. :The City's portion would be approximately \$60.000. It would possibly cost us that if we were to just fix the air leak, but we could get efficient blowers to save us energy with the grant.

Brent presented a letter from David and Kris Newton's lawyer. They were asking for a solution to a problem they were having, when the sewer line was blown out near their home. Brent was not aware that there was a problem. He went and spoke to the Newton's and came up with a solution. He will remove the cap on their sewer cleanout when blowing the lines next time.
