What criteria does Paul give for handling the situation?

3. What problems do you assume prompted 1 Co
12:12-31?

4. How does 1 Co 13:1-13 address the issues the the Corinthians are having?

Read 2 Co 12:20-21. What can you assume from these verses?

Day Two Workbook

Read: Acts 18:23, Gal 2:1-21, 3:1-29, 5:16-26.

1. Where did the idea, that works of the law were necessary come from?

How does Paul describe it in v.4?

2. Who is Cephas and what was the message his behavior was sending?

How did Paul react?

3. In Gal 3:3, what does Paul ask?

What did he mean?

4. What solution does Paul give them in Gal 5:16-26?

How can we begin by accepting salvation through faith and then fall back into works? How does God want to apply this in your life personally? Write a prayer in response.

Day Three Workbook

Read: Ro 1:1-15, 5:1-5, 8:12-39, 12:9-21

1. What was Paul obviously trying to equip the Roman believers to face?

2. Why can we “rejoice in our sufferings?”

3. What is the fruit(s) of suffering?

4. Re-read Ro 8:28, how do you understand it now, in light of the other passages?

Suffering is a necessary part of discipleship. It produces fruit which we need to grow and mature. In what area of your life is God wanting to apply what you have read today? What do you see differently, in light of what you have studied today? Write a prayer in response.

Day Four Workbook

Read: Ro 12:1-2, 2 Co 2:12-17, Eph 5:2, He 10:5,
He 13:15-16, 1 Pe 2:5.

1. What word keeps coming up in each of these passages?

Why would the culture they live in readily understand the need for a sacrifice to God?

2. Paul talks about being “more than conquerors”, why would this image resonate with a Roman audience?

How would Romans have defined a “conqueror”?

How did Paul define a “conqueror”?

We ARE more than conquerors! When we don't
feel like conquerors, could it be that we have
incorrectly defined winning? What area of your
life does God want you to reevaluate your
definition of “conqueror”? Write a prayer in
response.
