GOOD NEWS FROM PASTOR



"Watch your language!"

That warning can bring back all kinds of memories and feelings of when we were a child and an adult scolded us for our choice of impolite words. As adults, the use of impolite words is not as limited as it used to be to when or where we say them. But if such words are said in a

church, well, we are told, "Watch your language. You're in church!"

There are other words that twinge the conscience a lot more than impolite words can. "You have to try harder." "You need to have more faith." "You need to be a better person."

Those are words said every day and everywhere to every person. Such words always demand more of us. We say them to demand more of others. Sure, we can improve what we do, but to demand it of others every day is to inflict them with a tiring burden. To say that there is always room for improvement is the same as telling others that they are never good enough.

Any rule or law says that. So, God's laws say that. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your strength" is going to make us worry that we haven't used all of our heart or all our strength.

Jesus brings us a new vocabulary. He gives us something new to say. Jesus gives us words such as, "My peace be with you." When he says that, notice that he is giving us his peace. Notice that he is not demanding we do something. He is not telling us to do more or try harder. He is doing the giving of his peace. And it is his peace that tells us Jesus has done everything for us. We don't have to try harder or do more. It is already done. Jesus did it. See his death and rising. It's done!

As it is June, as summer is here and the sun shines and the days are warm or even hot, we will often be told, "It's nice out. You should be outside. You should enjoy the nice weather

because winter will be here before you know it. How can you waste such a nice day indoors?" We will say such things without even thinking. Yet by those words we put pressure on people. We demand they behave better. We need to watch our language.



Instead of making demands, we can offer people good things. We can say, "Look, I give you a wonderful, summer day. It's for you. Please, it is for you to enjoy." We make the summer day a gift instead of something for which they have to do more or do better. Or we offer to join them. "Come with me outside and let's take a walk. I want to spend time with you and it's really nice out."

Jesus has risen for us. He offers to be with us. He says that it is a merciful day today. He says it is a graceful day today. Such days do not depend upon the weather and are good whether it's summer or winter, sunny or rainy. Days full of mercy are a gift. Every day Jesus gives us his mercy. May that be your hope and strength.

Don't be root-bound

As a new gardener, Jan Riggenbach used to treat bedding plants with extreme care, setting them into soil without disturbing the roots. Eventually she learned that rough — even ruthless — treatment is better in the long run.

"If the plant has been growing in its pot so long that the roots are circling the bottom, I jab my finger into the bottom of the soil and pull down to untangle the roots," Riggenbach wrote in her gardening column. "If the whole pot is filled with circling roots, I have to be merciless. I don't worry if I break some of the roots. That's better than allowing the roots to continue to circle when the plants are growing in the garden."

In the same way, it's easy to grow complacent and inwardfocused in our walk with God. But bunched-up roots can't reach out for sustenance. So for maximum faith growth, dare to let God shake you up from time to time!
